INCINERATING PLANT NEARING COMPLETION

garbage heats a 200 gallon tank of water which is used to clean the garbage wagons and sends them from the plant in a perfectly sanitary condition.

The plant is capable of burning 21 tons of garbage on 150 pounds of coal, after the fire is started. Coal is kept in a bin, 9x13 feet, capacity 40 tons. Soft coal is used. The opening which receives the garbage is large enough to receive any amount of material, and dead animals of any size.

Tin cans as well as garbage can be burned in the plant. The process of burning is very refining and as the principle of burning is from the top to the bottom, there is positively no odor, at any time, no matter how low the stack might be.

The approach to the dumping place will be a slanting twelve foot drive, on one side and the same plan will be carried out on the exit side of the plant.

The wagons will drive directly into the plant from this slanting approach and when above the oven will dump the garbage. Then the wagons will be washed with scalding water and be sent out clean and neat in appearance.

While the plant is to be completed this week the official dedication will not take place until Saturday, the twentieth.

Situated as it is, facing the beautiful Skokie valley the plant gives one a pleasant impression, and when one thinks of the good use to which the citizens of Highland Park can put this incinerating plant, the impression generally prevalent concerning such, would be greatly changed. An inspection of the plant and a general idea of the working principle would be of interest to any citizen.

OPEN SHERIDAN ROAD WITH PAGEANT SAT.

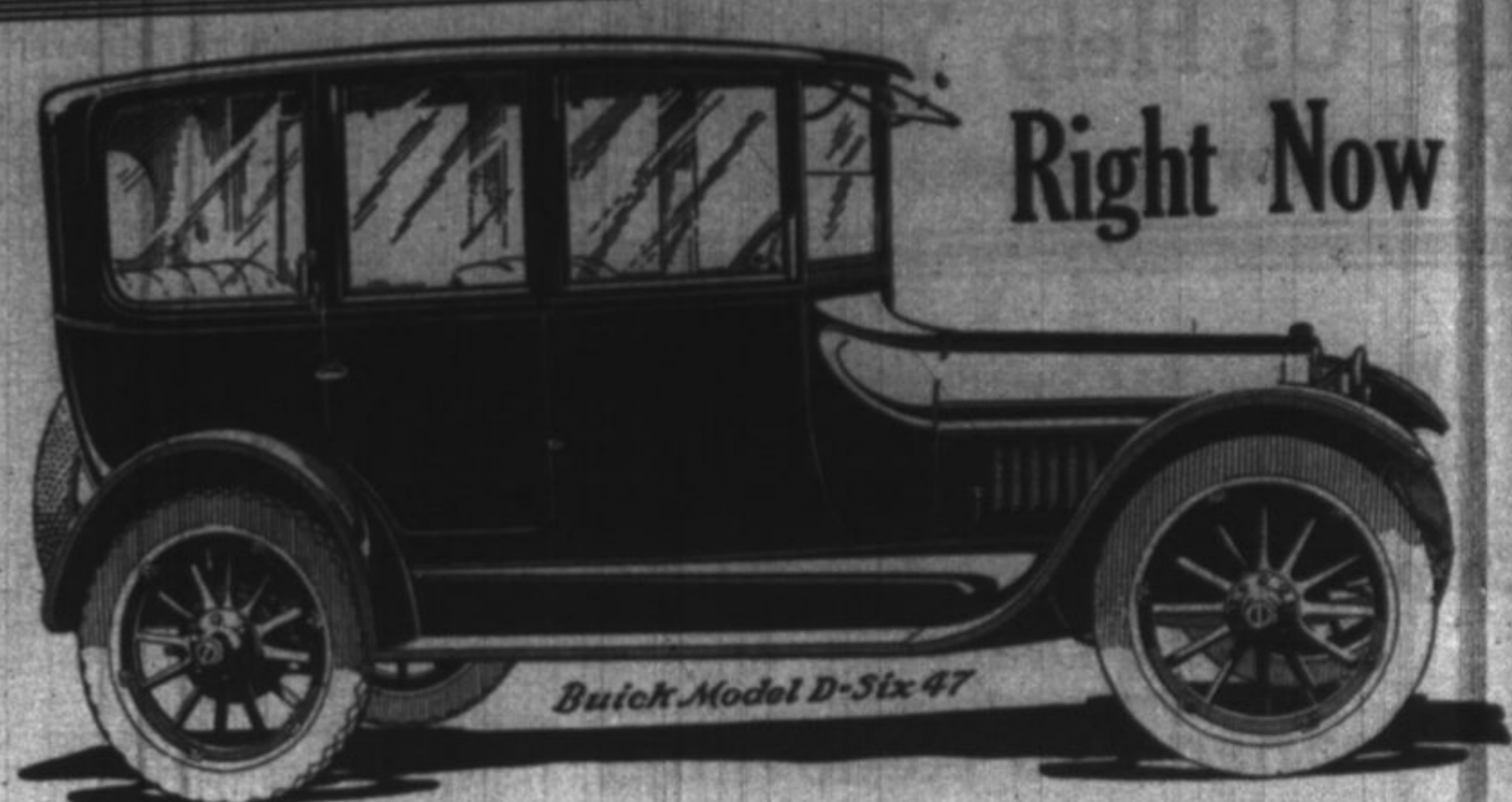
Several hundred Chicagoans motored from the Art Institute Saturday afternoon and met North Shore delegations at Winnetka. Amidst bombs that dropped flags over the crowd, Miss Minnie Mae Schmidt broke a bottle of champagne over the new pavement, Misses Elizabeth Korr and Marian Reese cut "mud" out of the felt barrier reading "Sheridan Mud Road" and after a dedicatory speech the cavalcade moved on to New Trier.

The same ceremony occurred here. The queen of the ceremony was Miss Kathrine Scheldenhelm and the scissor bearers Misses Henrietta Baird and Mary Worthington. At Kenilworth Miss Virginia Little christened the concrete and Misses Patty Foresman and Carolyn Jane Everett cut "mud" out of the barrier, making Sheridan Road a complete link from Chicago to the northernmost limits of Kenilworth.

Sheridan Road is by no means complete. The next step will be the obtaining of pavements in Winnetka, Highland Park and Lake Bluff until Sheridan Road is a smooth paved-way from Chicago to Milwaukee.
