RAID ON BLIND PIGGERS

Gunboats for Naval Training Station. Don't Misplace Your Patriotism. School Children Busy

Gunboat for Great Lakes
The U. S. S. Yantic and the U. S. S. Luzon, the gunboats which will serve as training ships for the Great Lakes Naval Training station and which will patrol the shores in this vicinity of the lake, with Waukegan as the base of the operations are expected to arrive at the naval station this week, after a trip from the Norfolk Navy Yard.

A bit of history is attached to the U. S. S. Isla de Luzon. It was one of the gunboats of the Spanish fleet, which was sunk by Admiral Dewey's fleet at the battle of Manila. The vessel was later raised and has been in service as a gunboat for years.

Don't Misplace Your Patriotism

This is the advice of Capt. W. A. Moffett, commandant of the United States naval training station, Great Lakes. Yesterday he said that hundreds of engineers of the four named classes are "misplacing their patriotism" by enlisting as common rookies in the army.

"Men who have these qualifications," said the captain, "are badly needed in some branch of the navy yards, or on board ship with the main fleet."

School Children to Gather Paper
Over five tons of paper was collected by the school children of Waukegan in the big campaign held last Thursday for the purpose of raising funds for the securing of the presence of an agricultural expert in Waukegan.

The 2,000 children of the schools worked during their spare moments of the day in gathering the paper. Every child was expected to bring not less than ten pounds of paper. In most instances the children brought five times that much. The paper will be sold and the money secured will be turned over to the fund.

Raid Blind Piggers
The Prosecution of the blind piggers in Waukegan and North Chicago and other sections of the county in the vicinity of the naval station and Fort Sheridan, was started Saturday night when seventeen United States Marshals swooped down on Waukegan and visited "locker clubs," alleged booze joints and pool rooms. Four arrests were made and evidence of the sale of liquor was collected from fifteen or sixteen locker clubs. The operators of these clubs will be compelled to face the federal courts on charges filed by District Attorney Clyn.

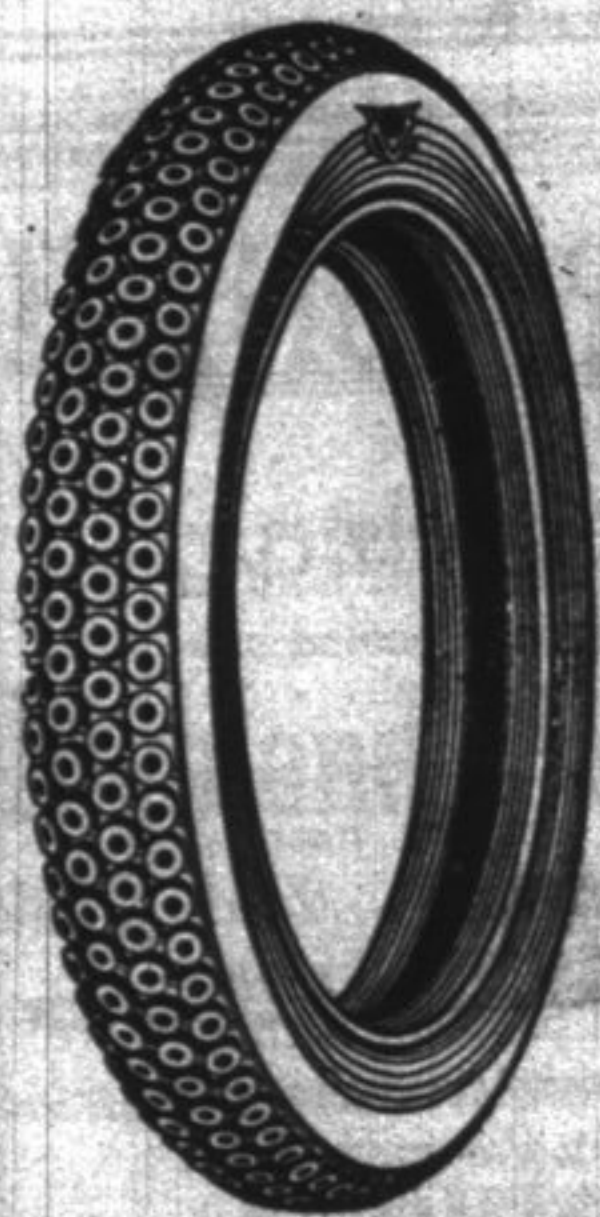

WINNETKA TO IMPROVE SHERIDAN ROAD

WORK PAID BY ASSESSMENT

Traffic Needs of Fort Sheridan Camp Cause Quick Action. Ordinance Affirmed May 11th by Judge Williams

Winnetka is doing its "bit". On May 11 the ordinance calling for paving of 1 1/2 miles of Sheridan Road from Kenilworth to Hubbard Hill was affirmed by the County Court, Judge Williams sitting. The work is to be paid for by special assessment and the Board of Local Improvements has ordered bids to be submitted on May 29 for construction of a concrete pavement identical with that on Sheridan Road in Kenilworth and New Trier Township.

By June 1 there will probably be 5,000 men in the Fort Sheridan camp and 25,000 at the Great Lakes station near Lake Bluff. The Government is taking steps to obtain practically all supplies by motor truck from Chicago. This tremendous auto traffic demands permanent pavement and the passage of the ordinance at this time is largely because the Winnetka President William McKenzie, Village Attorney Frederick Dickinson, Engineer Frank Windes and others have realized that it was a patriotic duty to give the best possible conditions for transport. Put on these grounds, it found little opposition. Proceedings were started under former President E. L. Rummeler.

Lake County road officials are now working to bring the roads leading into Fort Sheridan from the north in as good condition as possible. From the south the work of the Sheridan Road Improvement Association for several years past has resulted in a continuous highway, permanently improved with the exception of this stretch in Winnetka, which should be begun shortly.

Winnetka is doing its share in easing the burden of Uncle Sam in feeding and equipping the boys at Fort Sheridan.
