**\$600 IN TREASURY TOWARD AMBULANCE**

Joint Review of Local Battalions of Home Guards of North Shore to be held in August

At a meeting of the Highland Park Defense Council Tuesday evening, H. S. Vail, chairman of the finance committee, reported that there was about \$600 in the treasury toward the Highland Park ambulance and other expenses.

Burridge D. Butler, president of the Patriotic Food Growers Association, addressed the Council and suggested that a census of the householders of the city be taken as an aid in the propaganda for food conservation. The matter was referred to the Committee on Census, Conservation and Relief.

The Patrol Committee reported that 125 men have drilled with the Home Guards, and that a joint review of the local battalions along the North Shore will be held some time in August. Interest in this event is keen. Col. W. J. Nicholson has been asked to supply a drill master. He will do so as soon as one is available.

An important meeting of the Council will be held next Tuesday evening at 8:00 o'clock. All officers and committeemen are urged to attend.
