ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL

AN ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATION FOR CORPORATE PURPOSES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR FROM JUNE 1, 1917, TO MAY 31, 1918.

Section 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 1917, and ending May 31, 1918.

PARKS, BOULEVARDS, DRIVEWAYS AND BOATING BASINS For acquiring, laying out, establishing, constructing and maintaining parks, boulevards, driveways and boating basins \$6300.00

SALARIES OF OFFICERS For salaries of secretary, treasurer, attorney, engineer, clerks and other employes, including a police force \$200.00

Section 2. All unexpended balances of any item or items of any general appropriation made by this ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any item or items in the same general appropriation and for the same general purpose or in a like appropriation made by this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
