U. S. BRITONS URGED  
TO JOIN THE COLORS

Chicago Recruiting Missions Enlists  
Many for Service Under  
Union Jack

Since early in July Chicago Britons and Canadians have been flocking to enlist for active service at the British Recruiting Station, 54 and 56 W. Adams St. It is one of several similar recruiting stations recently opened throughout the United States.

Most of the Chicago recruits, who enlist for the duration of the war, elect to join the Canadian Expeditionary Force, and are sent in weekly contingents to Camp Borden, near Toronto. The others are divided among the Railway Construction Corps, Winnipeg; the Royal Flying Corps, Toronto; The British Expeditionary Force, Aldershot, and the Canadian Naval Squadron, Ottawa.

The Canadian soldier is paid \$1.10 per day, and is provided with every possible bodily comfort on his way to France and after he gets there. In addition to this, the Western Relief Fund looks after the needs of his dependents during his absence, and augments the separation allowance of the government to "Keep the Home Fires Burning" brightly and insure that the wife and kiddies will want for nothing while husband and father help to "make the world safe for Democracy."

Here is a rare chance for the American Briton, who has not become naturalized, to voluntarily "do his bit" in Freedom's crisis. There are slackers among British Americans as among all other nationalities. Later compulsions may be applied to force every able bodied man to serve either under the Stars and Stripes or Union Jack.

Public notice is hereby given that the County Court of Lake County, Illinois, has rendered judgment for a special assessment upon property benefited by the following improvement: Construction of an eight inch sanitary sewer with manholes, connections and branch "Y's", located and laid in, along and under Cedar Avenue and Wade Street, as follows: Beginning at a point in Cedar Avenue fifteen (15) feet south of the north line thereof in the line between lots one (1) and two (2) in Block Eighty seven (87) in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, produced northerly, extending easterly in a straight line to a point fifteen (15) feet south of the northerly line of Cedar Avenue, and twenty one (21) feet east of the west line of Wade street, thence on a line extending easterly in a straight line a distance of three hundred and ninety (390) feet to and connecting with the existing ten (10) inch sanitary sewer now in the ravine east of Wade street at a point fifteen (15) feet south of the north line of said Cedar Avenue, and beginning at a point thirty (30) feet north of the north line of lot seven (7) block seventy nine (79) in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, and twenty one (21) feet east of the west line of Wade street, thence south parallel to the west line of Wade street a distance of three hundred and fifty (350) feet to and connecting with the aforesaid eight (8) inch sewer to be laid in Cedar Avenue all in the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, as will more fully appear from the certified copy of the judgment on file in my office. That the warrant for collection of such assessment is in the hands of the undersigned.

All persons interested are hereby notified to call and pay the amount assessed at the Collector's Office, City Hall, corner Green Bay Road and Central Avenue, Highland Park, Illinois, within thirty (30) days from the date thereof.

Notice is further given that the assessment is divided in Five (5) installments. That the amount of the first installment is \$270.00 and that each of the remaining installments is \$200.00. That all installments draw interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum from August 17th, 1917. The first installment is payable on the 2nd day of January, A. D. 1918.

The second installment one year thereafter and so on annually until all installments are paid.
