**NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO CHANGE RATES**

To PATRONS OF THE NORTH SHORE GAS CO:

The North Shore Gas Company hereby gives notice to the public that it has filed with the State Public Utilities Commission of Illinois, schedules which will change the rates for gas service in the territories supplied by it with gas, namely the cities and villages of Waukegan, North Chicago, Lake Bluff, Lake Forest, Libertyville, Area, Highland Park, Highwood and Deerfield in the county of Lake and State of Illinois, and the City of Glencoe and Village of Winnetka, in the County of Cook and State of Illinois, and intermediate territory; that the said change of rates involve an increase of rates, to become effective on the first day of October, 1917, as follows:

**Net Rate**  
 First 10,000 cubic feet each month, at \$1.00 per M.  
 Next 30,000 cubic feet each month, at \$.90 per M.  
 Next 60,000 cubic feet each month, at \$.80 per M.  
 Next 100,000 cubic feet each month, at \$.70 per M.  
 Over 200,000 cubic feet each month, at \$.60 per M.

**Gross Rates**  
 The gross rate is to be 10c per M. cubic feet to be added to the above rate.

**Discount**  
 Bills to be sent out on or before the first of the month, and if paid on or before the tenth of the month, a discount of 10c per M. cubic feet would be allowed, making the net rates as shown in the above table.

**Prepayment Meters**  
 All gas sold through prepayment meters to be charged at the rate of \$1.00 per M. cubic feet net.

**Minimum Bill**  
 Minimum bill to be abolished.

**Service Charge**  
 A readiness to serve charge to be made each customer at the rate of 75c per month, in addition to the charges as shown in the above table.

All parties interested in this procedure may obtain information as to time and place of hearing upon this matter, by addressing the Secretary of the State Public Utilities Commission at Springfield, Illinois.
