**INTERESTING REPORT ON HOUSING CONFERENCE**

HELD AT LaSALLE HOTEL

Plan to Improve Housing Conditions in Small Cities and Proper Zoning of Residential and Business

The following is a report from Corporation Counsel Samuel S. Holmes who attended Sixth National Conference on Housing in America under the auspices of the National Housing Association on October 15, 16 and 17, at the Hotel La Salle: October 18, 1917

Dear Mr. Hastings—

As you requested me, I attended the Sixth National Conference on Housing in America held under the auspices of the National Housing Association, at the Hotel LaSalle, October 15th, 16th and 17th, and registered with this association as Corporation Counsel representing you as Mayor of Highland Park.

I heard several very interesting papers read on the subject of housing problems and kindred subjects, of interest to municipalities, in relation to the building and regulation of dwellings, houses, apartments and buildings used for business purposes.

This association is doing very good work, and work that would be of interest to the citizens of Highland Park. The general scope of the Association as I understand it, is not to improve housing conditions in tenements and more congested parts of large cities from the viewpoint of sanitation and ventilation, but also to improve housing and building conditions in small cities, such as Highland Park, and to plan for the proper zoning of such cities so that the residential and business parts of town will be properly protected and be able to maintain the general character of their respective locations in the city. The Association is also working toward the beautification of cities generally and through them, a great mass of information is available for the use of its members who care to avail themselves of it.

The membership fee for municipalities in this association is \$5.00, and I therefore recommend to you that the City of Highland Park join this association, and that the City cooperate with the association in the work that is being done by it through the proper committee.

Miss Rothschild, of 324 Lincoln Avenue, Highland Park is one of the Highland Park citizens interested in this work.
