**RESERVE MILITIA TO BE PROPERLY ARMED**

TO RECEIVE GUNS MONDAY

State Orders that the Volunteer Training Corps be Placed Under Its Own Set of Officers. Will Give Ball

The rifles are here. They arrived by motor truck in charge of Captain Turpin and Mr. Scott last Saturday. On the same day in the evening the officers and non-commissioned officers met, unpacked the guns, cleaned off the surplus packing grease, assembled the firing pins and put these intricate machines in order. Along with the firearms, also came the bayonet and scabbard, the straps are missing, however and no cartridge belts were sent. Members of Company C Illinois Reserve Militia will be given these arms on Monday next.

An order has been received from the state to place the Volunteer Training Corps under its own set of officers thus making it a probability that soon we will have within our town 120 trained men, all armed. The V. T. C. will likely have the Springfield (old pattern) 45-70 guns, as Krags are scarce and the state has many of these former guns, which are brand new and have never been used. To buy cartridge belts and other necessary equipment for Company C, it has been suggested that a grand military ball be given in the near future. This plan met with the hearty approval of all present at last Monday's session.

Company C extends a vote of thanks to Mr. Rothacher for his voluntary services in putting the Company through "setting up" exercises every Monday night. The men take to the new drill with vim and "pep" and a continuation of this scientific training is bound to put them in even, better condition than they now enjoy.

At the meeting of officers and non-commissioned officers last night it was decided to have the ball on Wednesday evening, November 28th, the night before Thanksgiving. The committee is making arrangements for good music and place to hold the dance, which in all probability will be the high school if it can be obtained for that night. Further announcement will appear in next week's Press.

**CHARLES L. GASTFIELD DIES SUNDAY MORNING**

Funeral Services Held Tuesday Afternoon. Interment in Northfield, Illinois

**Charles L. Gastfield**, for many years a resident of Highland Park, since 1882, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. W. E. Salyards on Sunday morning. Mr. Gastfield was seventy two years, and was born in Northfield, Ill., in 1845. Those who survive him are, his widow, Mrs. Gastfield and three daughters, Mrs. William Salyards, Mrs. W. H. Thomas of this city and Mrs. James Kelley of Chicago, one son, Mr. Charles Gastfield of Fremont, Mich., and eight grandchildren.

Funeral services were read by Rev. C. G. Unangst at the Salyards home at one o'clock, Tuesday, followed by burial at Northfield.

Mr. Gastfield, was a Grand Army man, having volunteered during the civil war with the 9th Illinois Cavalry. Two of his grandsons have followed his example and have enlisted with the colors in the hour of need.

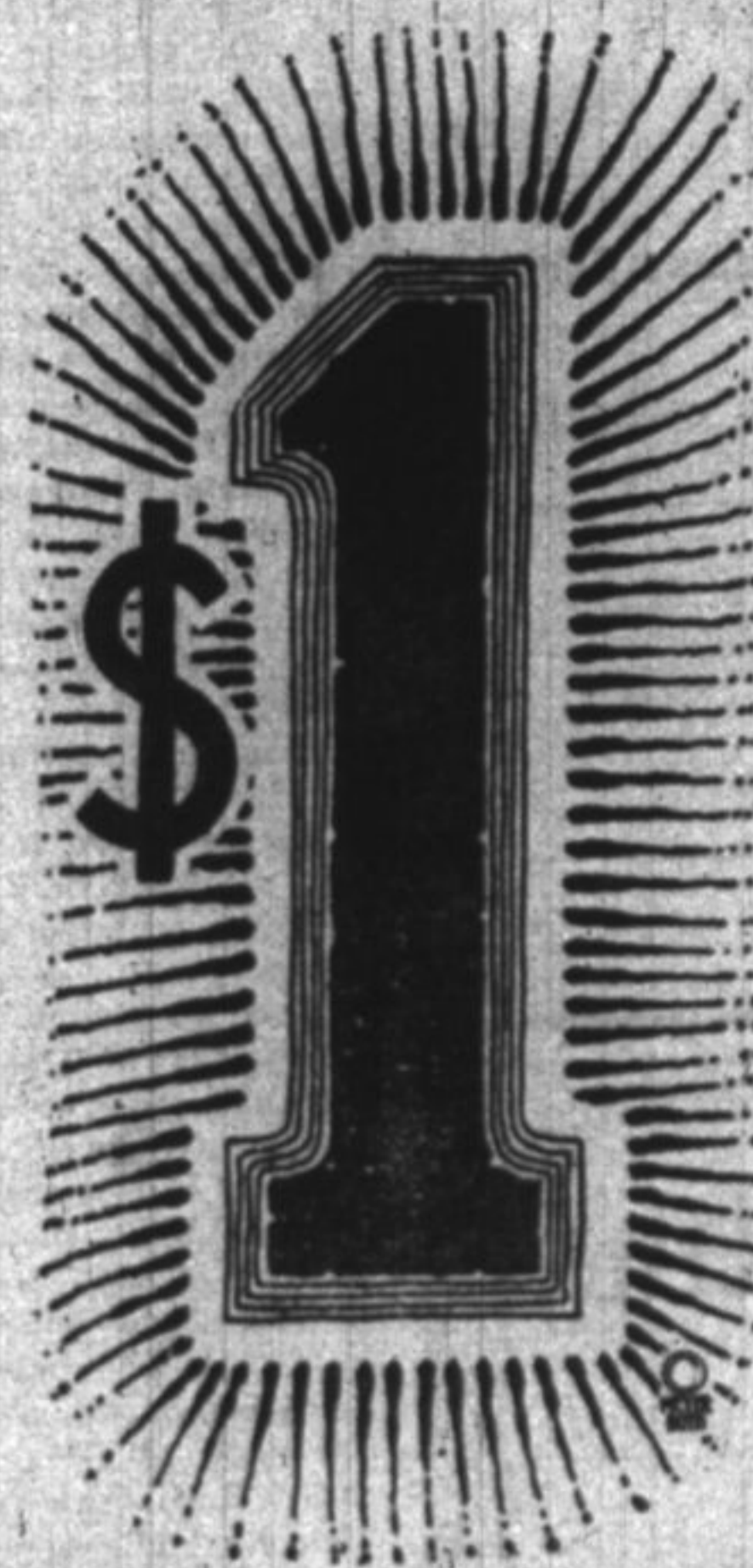
