All those who wish to hear it should bear in mind the fact, as this will be the only time it will be given. A complete program will appear in next week's issue of the Press. In addition to Mrs. Ashton, both Mr. Kreidler and Mr. George R. Jones, the violinist, will appear as soloists.

In an endeavor to give something original and appropriate, "White Gifts for the King" is offered this year for the Christmas service on Sunday morning, December 23rd, and is one in which everyone can have a part.
