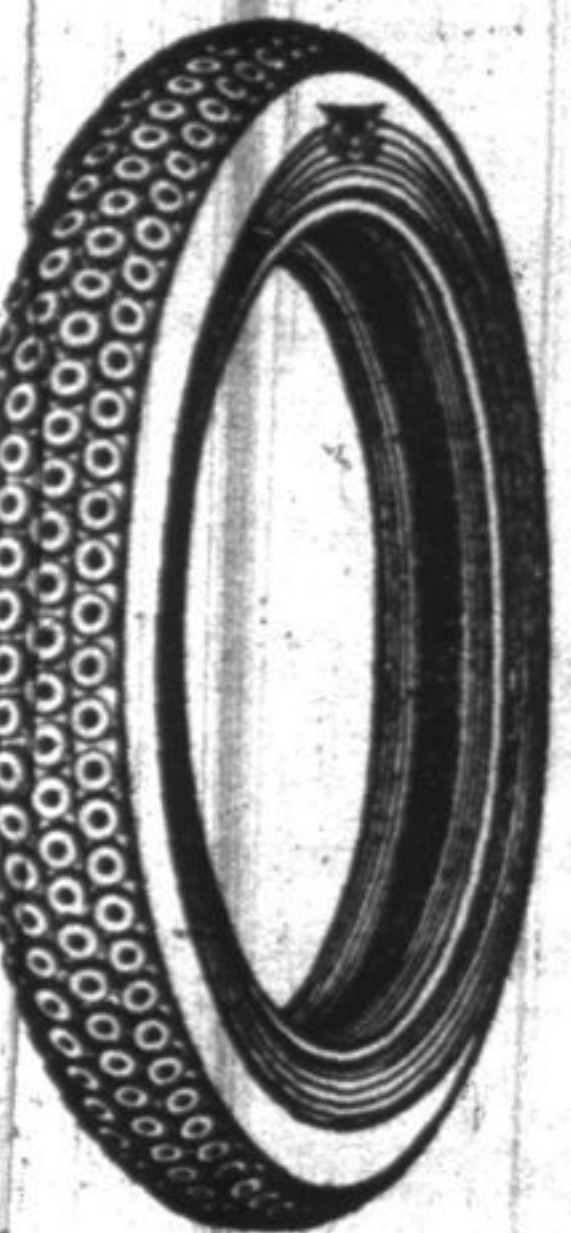

## DEFENSE COUNCIL MEETS TUESDAY

Catholics, which is simply another  
way of saying that, not only are  
Catholics welcome, but they come in  
great numbers without any sense of  
restraint.

The Jews had first planned to have  
buildings of their own at the War  
Camp. On finding that the Y. M. C.  
A. was willing to give them the use  
of its buildings for their direct reli-  
gious purposes, they decided to avail  
themselves of this offer instead of  
building their own structures so  
far as I have been informed, Jews  
have not built a single building  
within the lines. They use our  
buildings for special religious ser-  
vices and the Jewish men use all  
the other privileges whenever they  
like just as do other soldiers.

Right near Highland Park is the  
Great Lakes Naval Station. We have  
a number of buildings within the  
lines. I do not have first hand infor-  
mation as to the details there but  
know the general situation so thor-  
oughly as to warrant me in suggesting  
that your friends go to the camp,  
visit the Y. M. C. A. buildings and  
verify for themselves these state-  
ments. Let them see the commandant  
or any of his representatives for de-  
tails. It occurs to me that they may  
know Father Vattman who was the  
Roman Catholic chaplain at the Of-  
ficers Reserve Training corps re-  
cently held at Fort Sheridan. Father  
Vattman worked heartily with the  
Y. M. C. A. at Fort Sheridan and  
knows the details which will support  
the statements of this letter.

It is true that the Young Men's  
Christian Association is a Protestant  
Christian organization and restricts  
voting and office holding to members  
in good standing of Protestant Chris-  
tian churches. This has nothing  
whatever to do, however, with the  
service rendered to members or  
guests of the organization. These  
so-called active or voting members  
have no privileges that the others  
do not enjoy except those of addi-  
tional financial and administrative  
burdens.

Last week the Defense Council sent  
seventy five dollars to Capt. Den-  
son, 342nd Inf., in response to a re-  
quest for money to buy some needed  
articles for the amusement of the  
men in camp. Mr. Ruffner read a  
letter from him stating his men  
needed the following things: 7  
sweaters, 10 pairs wristlets, 23 hel-  
mets, 10 comfort kits, 17 scarfs,  
Miss Brown referred this matter to  
the Red Cross Shop in Chicago and  
the articles will be sent from there.  
This 342 Inf. is composed largely of  
Highland Park boys.

Many letters come to the State  
Council of Defense and its commit-  
tees, without identifying signatures.  
They are frequently signed "Ameri-  
can," "A Loyal Citizen," "An Ameri-  
can Mother" and the like.

What frequently seems to be im-  
portant information is contained in  
such letters. That is to say it would  
be important if it were stamped with  
the authority of an actual signature:  
if the writer would identify himself  
so that it might be followed up.

Obviously, the Council cannot act  
upon anonymous reports. If it should  
do so it would be investigating mar-  
nets every other day. Nor should  
anyone be fearful of signing his  
name, of identifying himself, in any  
communication to the Council. Any  
information which should be given  
in confidence will be received in con-  
fidence. No person of right motives,  
or who has valuable information to  
give will get into trouble by disclos-  
ing his identity to the Council.

The Council is looking for all the  
information it can get that will be  
of service to the country. It does not  
blink at the fact that America has  
enemies at home as well as abroad.  
People throughout the state have op-  
portunities to learn things the Coun-  
cil should know, and would be glad  
to learn. Anyone having such infor-  
mation should write the Council or  
any of its committees frankly and  
freely, and sign his right name.
