and days of heavy gunfire and infantry attack into a shattered, nerve-racked rabble — if they but knew that at some such moment as this there may come to a huge, efficient cavalry force the opportunity to strike such a mighty blow as to end this terrible war, there would be no fear that the critical moment would find that force lacking in numbers of horses or in stamina. For the American people would see that, when their soldier boys wedge between the boys of France and the boys of Britain, they shall do everything for their needs and the needs of the animals which will go with them to battle.

Many people think that this is a horse-less war. On the contrary, motor vehicles seldom go within five miles of the firing line; therefore, horses and mules are indispensable for hauling food, munitions, and other supplies to the soldiers, and for bringing up the artillery as well as for the cavalry service. So by helping the army horses you help the army men!

The Red Star work is a national necessity. It is the bridge between national administration and the emergency which crop up every day, every hour. It is the voluntary adjunct to a conscript force.
