NO SALOONS FOR WAUKEGAN

Lake Forest and Antioch Merchants Charge for Delivery Service. Telephone Men Wear Snow Shoes

Waukegan Satisfied Without Saloons Judging by the expressions heard on all sides the wets will have an uphill job getting signatures to the petition which they must file in court before the local option proposition can be placed on the ballot at the spring election.

Saloons again? No chance! says Thomas Tyrell, Waukegan's assistant chief of police, the man who is in closer touch with the sentiment of Waukegan than any other one individual.

"The day of the saloons in Waukegan is past," the assistant chief said, "and what is more, we can get along without them very nicely. There was a time when I was inclined to fear that the city would have a difficult time getting along without the \$40,000 a year revenue, but we have shown that we can get along without it--so what excuse is there for bringing the saloons back?"

Lake Forest and Antioch Merchants Charge for Delivery

On account of the present high cost of delivering goods the Merchants of Lake Forest have raised the prices on delivering. The price on each delivery of one hundred pounds or under has been placed at ten cents and it is said that that does not cover the cost.

Beginning Monday, January 14, Antioch merchants charge for delivering packages of all kinds as follows: Local deliveries, 5 cents; lake deliveries, 10 cents; special local deliveries, 10 cents. Orders must be in before 9:30 o'clock.

Telephone Men Wear Snowshoes

Because there are so many roads impassable through snow blockades, the telephone company has sent a consignment of snowshoes into Lake county for use by linemen and they are now using them in locating trouble along the various lines.

In all a dozen pairs are available out of the different offices.

INCOME TAX

Prepare and File Your Schedule

In accordance with the provisions of the Federal Revenue Act, every unmarried person with an income of \$1,000 or over and every married person with an income of \$2,000 or over must file a schedule during the months of January and February with the Internal Revenue Collector.

The public will be interested to know that an official representative of the Treasury Department will visit Highland Park and remain here from February 8th to the 12th ready to give aid and advice in the preparation of such Income Tax schedules.
