German alien enemies are hereby directed to report to the post office ocated in the district in which they

Each German alien enemy is required to bring with him to the piace of registration four photo graphs not larger than 3x3 inches, on thin paper with light background. At the place of registration he will be given full instructions as to procedure in filling application for reg-

An alien enemy required to register and who falls to complete his registration within the time fixed therefor, in addition to all other penalties prescribed by law, is liable to restraint, imprisonment and detention for the duration of the war. Up to today five men have registered and a number of applications

In accordance with the provisions of the Federal Revenue Act, every unmarried person with an income of \$1,000 or over and every married person with an income of \$2,000 or over must file a schedule during the months of January and February with the Internal Revenue Collector.
