### RED CROSS SERVICE IS AUTHORIZED BY LAW

IMMEDIATE RELIEF GIVEN

Home Bureau Service Department Keeps Boys in Touch With the Folks at Home Sustains Morale

As a result of conferences called by the Secretary of War between representatives of the Surgeon General's Office and the Red Cross, the following general order has been prepared and approved by the Secretary and the Acting Chief of Staff.

It is the desire of the Secretary of War, as it should be of all officers of the Army, to do everything possible for the comfort and welfare of the soldiers, and to make use of such agencies as are authorized and are in a position to contribute to that end, in addition to the provisions made by the Government. The American Red Cross is a body authorize by law to render services of th character. The following general statement outlining certain approved activities of the Red Cross, and methods for carrying them on, is published for the information and guidance

#### Functions of the Red Cross

1. To distribute sweaters, mufflers, helmets, socks, comfort kits, etc., and to receive the assistance and cooperation of all officers in making the distribution fair, equal, and where

2. To render emergency relief of every kind upon the request or suggestion of an officer in charge. All officers are instructed to avail themselves of this assistance whenever. in their opinion, advisable. Officers should be none the less diligent in attempting to foresee the needs of their department in order that they may be supplied through regular Government channels. All such requests must be approved by the commanding officer, who will cause a record to be kept of all such articles.
