And now the people and armies the allied nation need all the cloth and leather in the world, and more. There is not in the world much material as is needed. What we are asked to do is to divide the clothes we have with these unfortunate ones who have nothing.

This appeal leaves a very short time in which to work, and necessarily some people may be overlooked when the one in charge of your district is making her requests clothing. If you will notify the Red Cross Shop or Miss Mary L. Sedgwick, someone will call at your home and get the clothing.


