of the famous Black Watch Regiment of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces which went to France early in the war. During the big German raid at Vimy Ridge, Lieut. Hamilton's men had all been shot down. He operated a machine gun himself and stopped the raid and accounted for 750 dead Germans. Was himself severely wounded and is now 75% unfit for active service.

Professor Soares is a wonderful speaker and his topic for the evening will be "FIGHT THE NEXT WAR NOW."

Price of Ice to be Increased

On account of prices of Chemicals, Labor and Fuel advancement, the wholesale price of ice will be advanced by the Purity Ice Co. 50c per ton April 1st and 50c more June 1st. The price of hay and oats have doubled and other expenses have increased accordingly. The dealers have agreed to only raise the price to the public of \$1.00 per ton covering only the advance of the wholesale price. To do this, the public must cooperate with us in illuminating as much as possible the 25 lb. delivery and make their arrangement to take Ice on regular calls of the wagon.

All special deliveries will be charged 25c extra. These prices to take effect April 1st. All books will be billed at \$9.50 per ton and if paid for within 10 days of date of bill there will be a 50c discount or 25c for 1-2 ton book.
