BOARD OF LOCAL IMPROVEMENTS OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that bids will be received for the construction of a cast iron lateral main water supply pipe, with fire hydrants, special castings and shut off valves, to be constructed and laid in along and under St. Johns Avenue from the south end of the present water main at the intersection of St. Johns Avenue and Beech Street and extending from thence south parallel with the easterly line of St. Johns Avenue and twenty one (21) feet westerly therefrom for a distance of four hundred and seventy (470) feet to a point twenty (20) feet south of the north line of Cedar Avenue and for the construction of a cast iron lateral main water supply pipe four (4) inches internal diameter with fire hydrants, special castings and shut off valves, from the last above mentioned point, thence east in a line twenty-one (21) feet south of and parallel with the northerly line of Cedar Avenue for a distance of seven hundred (700) feet to and connecting with the existing six (6) inch water main now laid twenty-one (21) feet east of the easterly line of Wide Street, all in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, as a whole in accordance with the ordinance therefor.

Said bids will be opened on the 19th day of April, A. D. 1918 at the hour of 5:30 o'clock p. m. at the office of the Board of Local Improvements in the City Hall of the City of Highland Park.
