RAVINA SCHOOL
Yesterday afternoon a meeting for the mothers was held at the school. An exhibit of the children's work was given.
The annual baby party for the children under six years of age is being held this afternoon.
The first and second grade pupils have charge of the entertaining. There are sixty children in Ravinia all under six years of age.

ELM PLACE SCHOOL
Moving picture operators in the employ of the State Department of Public Instruction began on Monday to prepare the film entitled, "A Modern School", all the illustrations for which are to be taken from the elementary and high school in Highland Park. The operators will be here at intervals for the next two of three weeks. The superintendent of public instruction represented by his assistant, Mr. U. J. Hoffman, is watching the progress of the film. This film will be used for the first time at the Illinois Centennial celebration in Springfield in August and then will be released for use at any point in the state. The plan calls for films showing the work from the kindergarten through the high school and in addition to that the dramatization of a school of long ago. For this latter school a log cabin on Green Bay Road has been obtained and will be provided with the meagre equipment of schools of pioneer days. Some of the program of such a school will be reproduced and the schoolmaster is to be a man who taught a district school over fifty years ago. High school boys and girls and small children from Elm Place School will enact the part of school children of long ago.
The third grade children had their spring farm trip on Wednesday. The three B's went to the Ziesing farm north of Deerfield and the three A's had the trip to the Arcady farm and Dairy west of Lake Forest. Material collected on these trips furnishes much of the spring activities of the children in those grades in the form of reading, writing, spelling, drawing, oral languages, etc.
The six B's have taken out of the storage boxes the grafts which they had made and packed away in January and found most of them in good condition.
They have set these out in trenches in the flower beds at the school house and are hoping that the little apple trees thus started will make a good growth during the coming summer.
