## THE NAVY IS CALLING FOR 100,000 MORE MEN

ACTIVE DUTY IS PROMISED

Thus Far, During the War the Navy Has Met Every Call and Requirements. An Attractive Service

In order to prepare for all contingencies and be assured of an adequate force to man all ships launched, the Navy Department has issued a call for 100,000 men in the various branches of the Naval Reserve Force. A large number of these men are sent immediately to active duty at sea during the present war. It is very necessary that the Navy be prepared to meet the demands made upon it for armed guards on the Merchant Marine, for patrol ships and submarine chasers, and it is the intention to always have ready a force of men to man all ships launched and put into service. The Navy has played a very important part from the beginning of the war, and has met every demand to date without failure.

Upon the declaration of war, the Navy, including all reserves, consisted of about 50,000 men; at the close of the first year of the war, there were over 300,000 enlisted men serving in the regular and in the reserve service. On January 1st, 1917, 176 vessels of all types were in commission. There are today in commission 1,234 Naval vessels, including battleships, cruisers, gunboats, destroyers, mine vessels, supply vessels, submarine chasers, and converted yachts. By the end of this year, there will be completed 555 additional Naval vessels, and it is to meet the demand for crews for these additional vessels that this call is made.

When war was declared, the Naval Training Station could accommodate approximately 6000 apprentice seamen. Today there are barracks at the Training Station for 50,000 men, to say nothing of men training in the Naval Districts in barracks and schools provided by the Bureau. To provide junior officers, the very best material that the country affords has been obtained, and these young men have been given intensive training at various schools, so that they can start at their work afloat and obtain additional training. There is always the chance for any young man who has the proper capabilities to advance and obtain a commission in the Reserve Force.

Thus far during the present war the Navy has met every call and every requirement. Absence of criticism from the press and other sources, shows exclusively the manner in which the Navy Department has met the crisis and it is the firm belief and intention of all connected with the Navy Department that the record in the coming year will at least equal, and it is hoped will exceed, the record of the past year. There is no other course of training known in the world which surpasses the training received by a young man going into the Navy. Mentally, morally and physically he is watched and developed to the utmost. The idea of discipline, initiative, push, and determination is encouraged in him from the start. He is watched and encouraged to study and develop himself, and every advantage is offered to him and every inducement to better himself.

Nobody is asked to accept statements made without investigation, and such investigation and inquiry is welcomed by anyone having connection with the Naval organization.

## A CHANCE TO HELP FRENCH WAR REFUGEES

Contributions to Secours National, A French Organization Can be Mailed to Address Below

"Our funds are all but exhausted. The present needs are appalling. Such is the message sent out by the Secours National, a fund for the relief of French women and children and Belgian refugees, under the patronage of the president of the French Republic.

The Secours National is the principal organization in France for the relief of noncombatant sufferers from the war.

It was formed and is managed by representatives of the most important political and religious organizations upon the strictly non-partisan basis. It provides immediate relief for the inhabitants of the places destroyed by the enemy and funds for the reconstruction of their homes; it maintains workshops for the unemployed; supports shelters and restaurants for French and Belgian refugees; makes provisions for the care of orphaned or lost children and of old people and assists in the relief of the thousands of civilians made prisoners by the Germans, and, after many months of imprisonment sent back through Switzerland in the most lamentable condition.
