D. 1918 for the purpose of submitting to the voters the question of the annexation to the City of Highland Park the territory described as follows: All that land bounded on the North by the corporation limits of said City, on the east by the corporation limits of said City on the South by the quarter section line of Section thirty-six (36) and on the west by the center line of Green Bay Road, said land being more particularly described as follows: to-wit: All that part of the Southwest Quarter (S.
