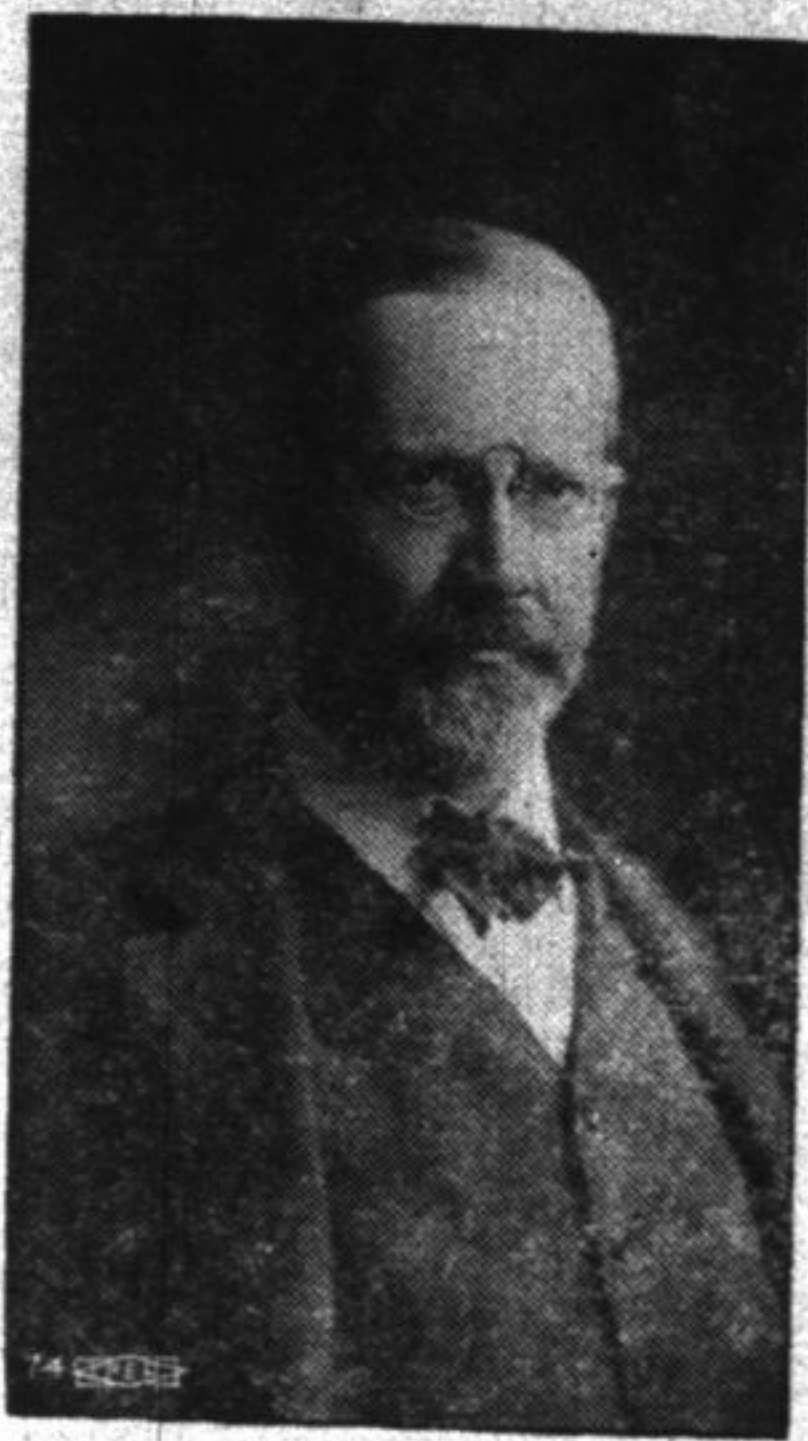

Barwell in 1900—The Woman's Magazine of New York the next year—The only Republican elected from Lake County in fifteen years (1909-11)—Secured the passage of six laws now on the statute books.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that bids will be received for the construction of a four (4) inch cast iron water main with fire hydrants, valves, valve boxes and special castings to be constructed and laid in along and under Glencoe Avenue and Gray Avenue, beginning and connecting with the present water main in Glencoe Avenue located twenty (20) feet north of the south line of Lincoln Avenue at a point nineteen (19) feet west of the easterly line of Glencoe Avenue thence south in Glencoe Avenue on a line parallel to and nineteen (19) feet westerly from the easterly line of said Avenue to the intersection of a line nineteen (19) feet south of and parallel with the north line of Gray Avenue thence east parallel to the north line of Gray Avenue to an intersection with the present water main laid in the easterly side of Ridgewood Drive, all in the City of Highland Park, County of Lake and State of Illinois, as a whole in accordance with the ordinance therefor.

Said bids will be opened on the 30th day of August A. D. 1918, at the hour of 5:15 o'clock P. M., at the office of the Board of Local Improvements in the City Hall of the City of Highland Park.
