

Highland Park's Honor Roll

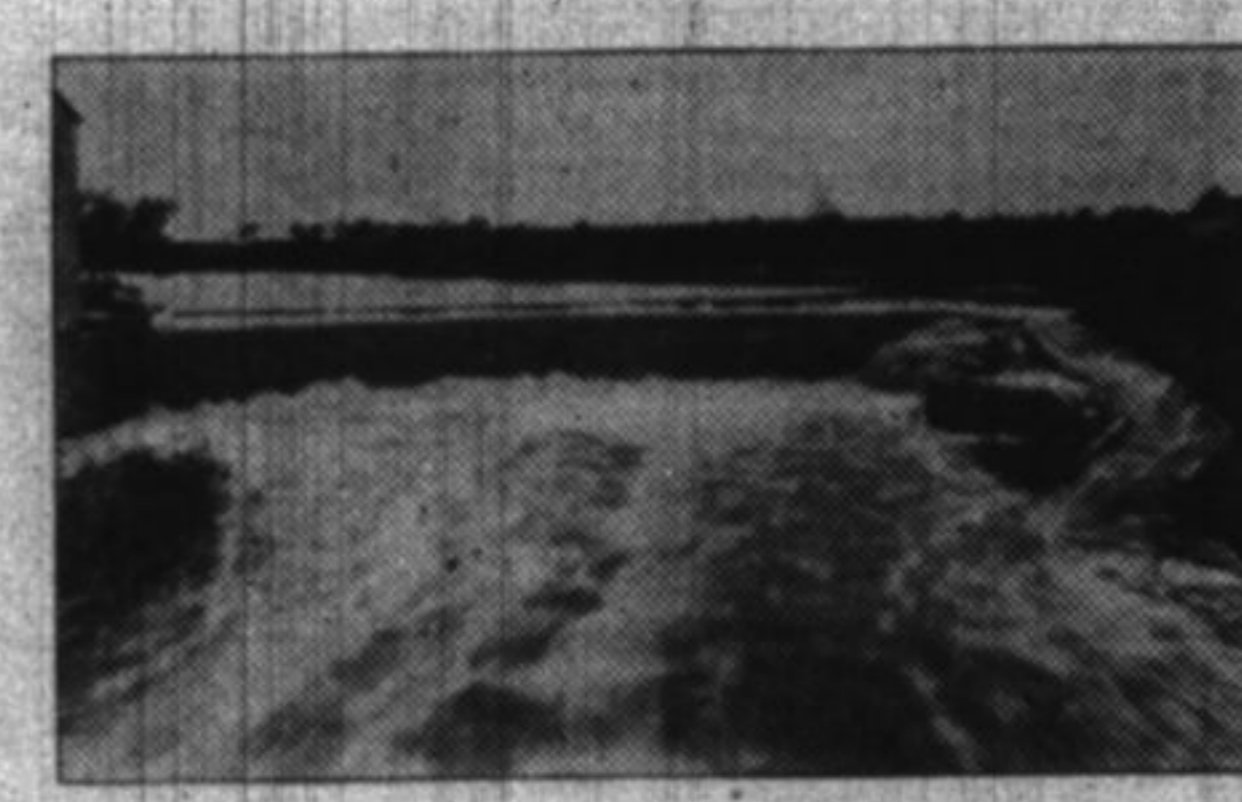
