The welfare house is primarily intended for the convenience of those officers and men of the United States Army and Navy who are interested in Christian Science, but a welcome will also be extended to any soldier or sailor who desires to come.

The Christian Science Welfare House is situated in a convenient center, close to the American Embassy and the busy thoroughfare around Victoria Station. Various bus routes pass close by, and tube and underground railway are easily and quickly reached, but the creeperclad house itself stands in a wide sunny square, where spreading plane trees cast a cool shade in the long, hot summer days.

The house is designed to help and befriend in every way the men of the allied forces. A WEALTH OF BOOKS

You a Wage Earner, A Home Maker, a Thinker, a Novice or an Expert?

Saturday Evening Post, is now ready in book form for the enjoyment all. It is a breezy story told baseball lingo, with every chapter

full of laughter. you look at it tucked away on the shelves but it holds the key to the big situations. It is not a conventional phrase book but is compiled from a real course of spoken lessons as given to some of the first troops to go across from one of the English provinces. Simple, practical, con centrated and efficient, it claims to be. Two tales of wild adventure are the books of Edgar Rice Borroughs Tarzan of the Apes and its firm quel, "The Return of The following books are on their way to the Public Library from the publisher, and will be ready for circulation soon. They delight one even as they thrill one with incredulity at the marvelous feats of streng and miraculous adventure; but they are so well written, and they claim for themselves nothing but the charm of a good tale, and a great

many readers find them irresistable. Two books of Enos A. Mills, "Your National Parks," and "Wild Life on the Rockies," are full of the lure of the great western park reservations and the natural inhabitants of those regions. Mr. Mills' vividly interesting story of the parks is admirably supplemented with a wealth of practical guide-book knowledg furnished by his colloborator, Mr Lawrence F. Schmeckebier, chief of the Bureau of Publications of the Dept. of the Interior.

Complete and independent in itself, yet a companion book to the great epic begun by Selma Lagerlof in "Jerusalem," is her new book "The Holy City," translated by V, F Howard. Added to the interest of the plot of the story, is the recent historical event, the capture of Jerusalem by the Allies, although this does not enter into the make-up of the book itself.

"The Way Out" by Emerson Hough is a romance of the feud district of the Cumberlands of Kentucky, a story of modern social problems. "Towards Morning." by I. A R. Wylie, is the latest book by the author of "The Shining Heights." "The Japanese Twins," by Lucy Fitch Perkins is another of charming juvenile stories of various races and times

An excellent map hangs on the bulletin board opposite the entrance to the library which is annotated to date showing the advances and vic tories of the Allies on the Western front. Beside it hangs a small repro duction of an exhibition of paintings which the National Food Adminis tration has had on Above the shelves of newest acquisitions is a colored poster and a shelf of books on public health and child welfare. This has been found very interesting by some of the more thoughtful readers.
