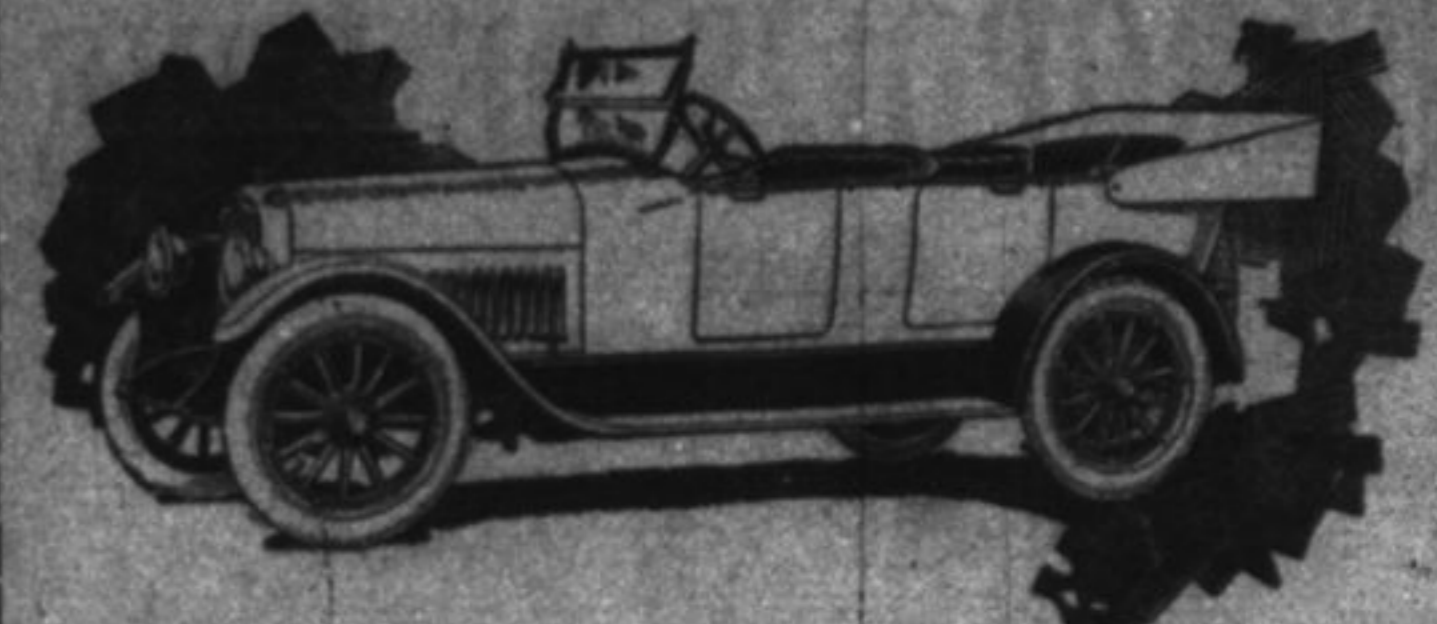

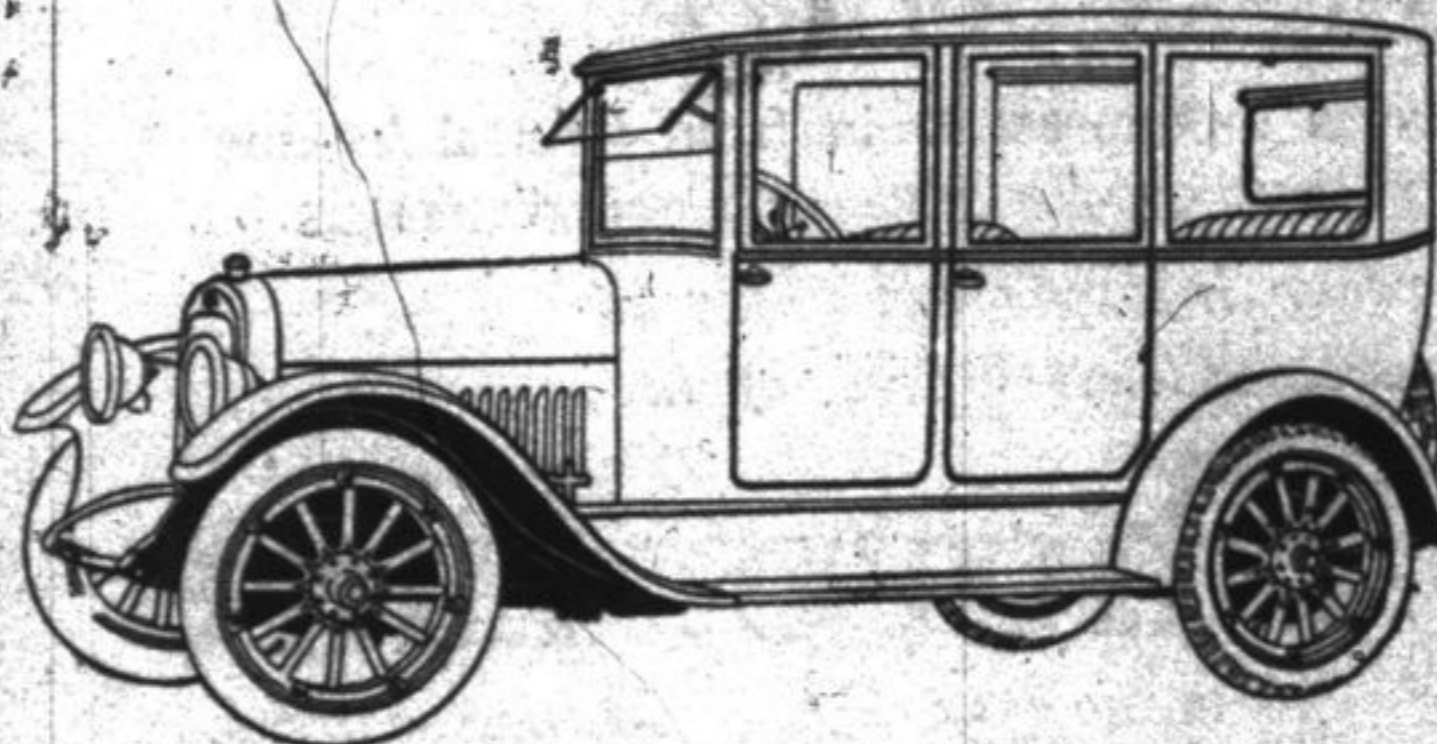

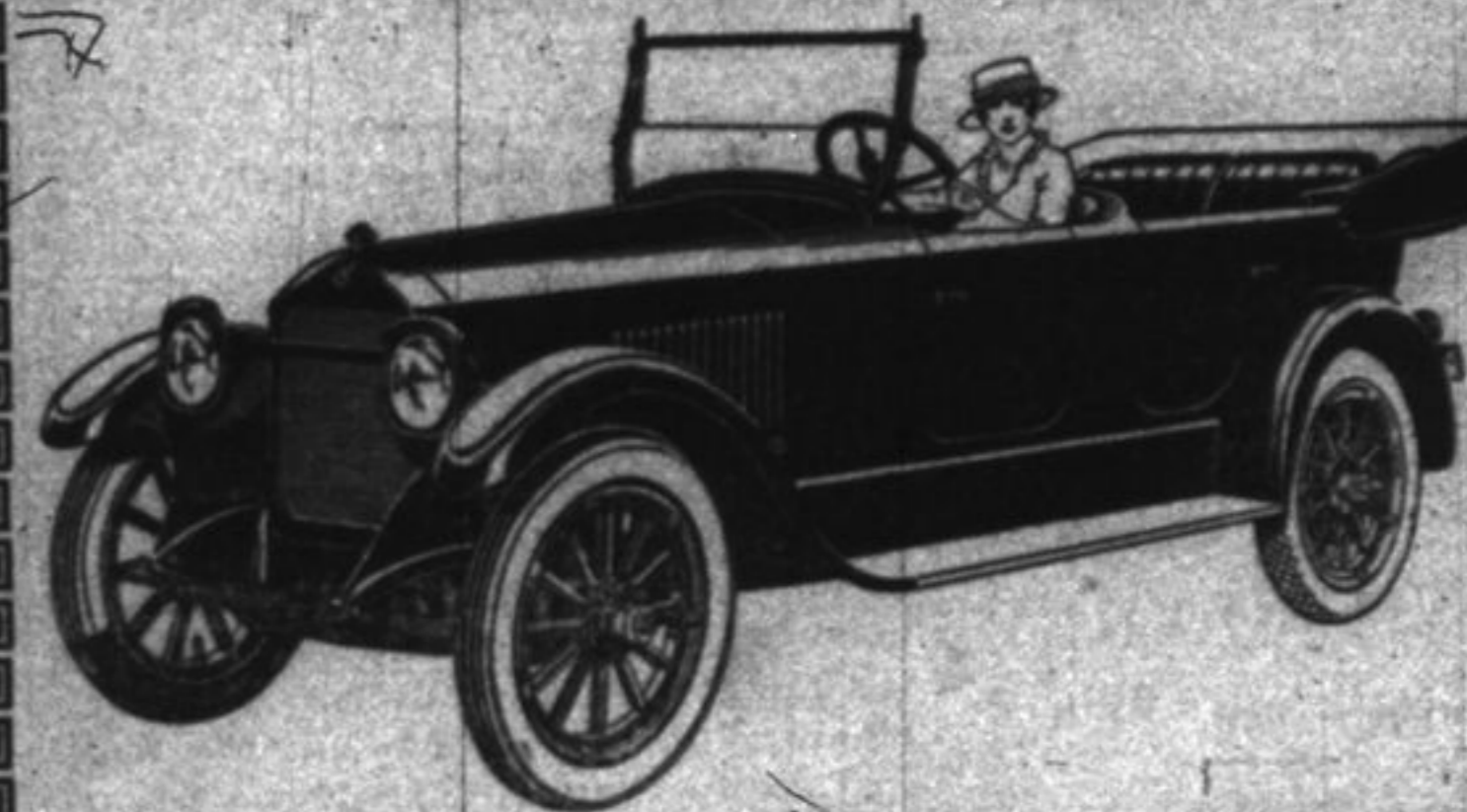

A TRIBUTE TO MR. VAIL BY THOMAS R. QUAYLE

"With the departure of Mr. H. S. Vail from this life, Highland Park has lost one of its very greatest citizens. Since the Civil War, of which he was a veteran, his martial ardor found expressing in the passing of good laws and their rigid enforcement. An exceedingly able business man, he was generous in the use of his means for benevolent ends. In the long battle for the emancipation of Highwood, in the war against vice and crime in Chicago, and in his patriotic devotion to similar ends for his country Mr. Vail was a good soldier. On a monument by the Greeks to one of their great generals was this epitaph, "We greatly long-

ed for him in the day of battle! So shall we who have fought by his side feel in the future."
