CAR AT FORT SHERIDAN

For Rent - 5 room furnished Harry Dorsey Leaps on Track When Electric Car Was But Fifty Feet Away

> Harvey Dorsey, a convalescent soldier at Fort Sheridan base hospital, 5 pd whose home is in Girde, Mo., was killed instantly at 8 o'clock Monday night when run over by a Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee electric train. The accident accurred 700 feet north of the north gate at Fort Sher-

According to the motorman, Dorsey darted out of the darkness when the train was barely fifty feet away. 4-5-pd. Sinking to his knees in the middle of the track. Dorsey wasted for the heavy train to strike him.

> The motorman was terrified by the suddenness of the impending tragedy. He tugged at the whistle cord frantically at the same time clamping on the emergency brakes. If Doresy heard the whistle he paid no attention, his evident desire being to commit suicide. It was a physical impossibility to stop the big car in time to avoid an accident. The soldier was ground to death under the

Dorsey's body was picked up and removed to Fort Sheridan morgue where the inquest will be held.

Dorsey saw service overseas and was sent to Fort Sheridan base hospital. He is said to have been a victim of shell shock.
