SOLDIER KILLED BY CAR AT FORT SHERIDAN

Harry Dorsey Leaps on Track When Electric Car Was But Fifty Feet Away

Harvey Dorsey, a convalescent soldier at Fort Sheridan base hospital, whose home is in Girde, Mo., was killed instantly at 8 o'clock Monday night when run over by a Chicago North Shore and Milwaukee electric train. The accident occurred 700 feet north of the north gate at Fort Sheridan.

According to the motorman, Dorsey darted out of the darkness when the train was barely fifty feet away. Sinking to his knees in the middle of the track, Dorsey waited for the heavy train to strike him.

The motorman was terrified by the suddenness of the impending tragedy. He tugged at the whistle cord frantically at the same time clamping on the emergency brakes. If Dorsey heard the whistle he paid no attention, his evident desire being to commit suicide. It was a physical impossibility to stop the big car in time to avoid an accident. The soldier was ground to death under the wheels.

Dorsey's body was picked up and removed to Fort Sheridan morgue where the inquest will be held.

Dorsey saw service overseas and was sent to Fort Sheridan base hospital. He is said to have been a victim of shell shock.

OCEAN LINERS TO DOCK AT GREAT LAKES PORTS

Movement to Connect Lake Region With Atlantic Assumes Form at Milwaukee

The dream of the future, of ocean liners docking at Waukegan, Kenosha and Racine and Milwaukee and other parts on the Great Lakes was featured at the conference held in Milwaukee on Friday and men who attended believed that some day that dream will come true.

Resolutions passed by the members of the conference will ask congress to act with a view of uniting with Canada in the building of a deep canal which would connect up the great lakes region with the Atlantic ocean and make it possible for the great ocean steamers which ply the Atlantic to the lakes and open a direct export trade between Waukegan other like cities with the nations of the world.

United States Senator Irvine L. Lenroot, who was a guest of the conference, assured the delegates that their program meets his approbation and that he will give it every assistance possible.

"The day is near," declared the senator, "when Milwaukee and other Wisconsin ports will see ocean going vessels at their docks. This means more to the prosperity of the middle west than any other movement which has ever been proposed. Shipping centers of the great lakes will become shipping centers of the world."

ROAD WORK FOR LAW BREAKERS ADOPTED

Supervisors of Boone County Authorize Step There Which Should be Tried in this County
