Two lively prayer meetings which are held every Wednesday evening

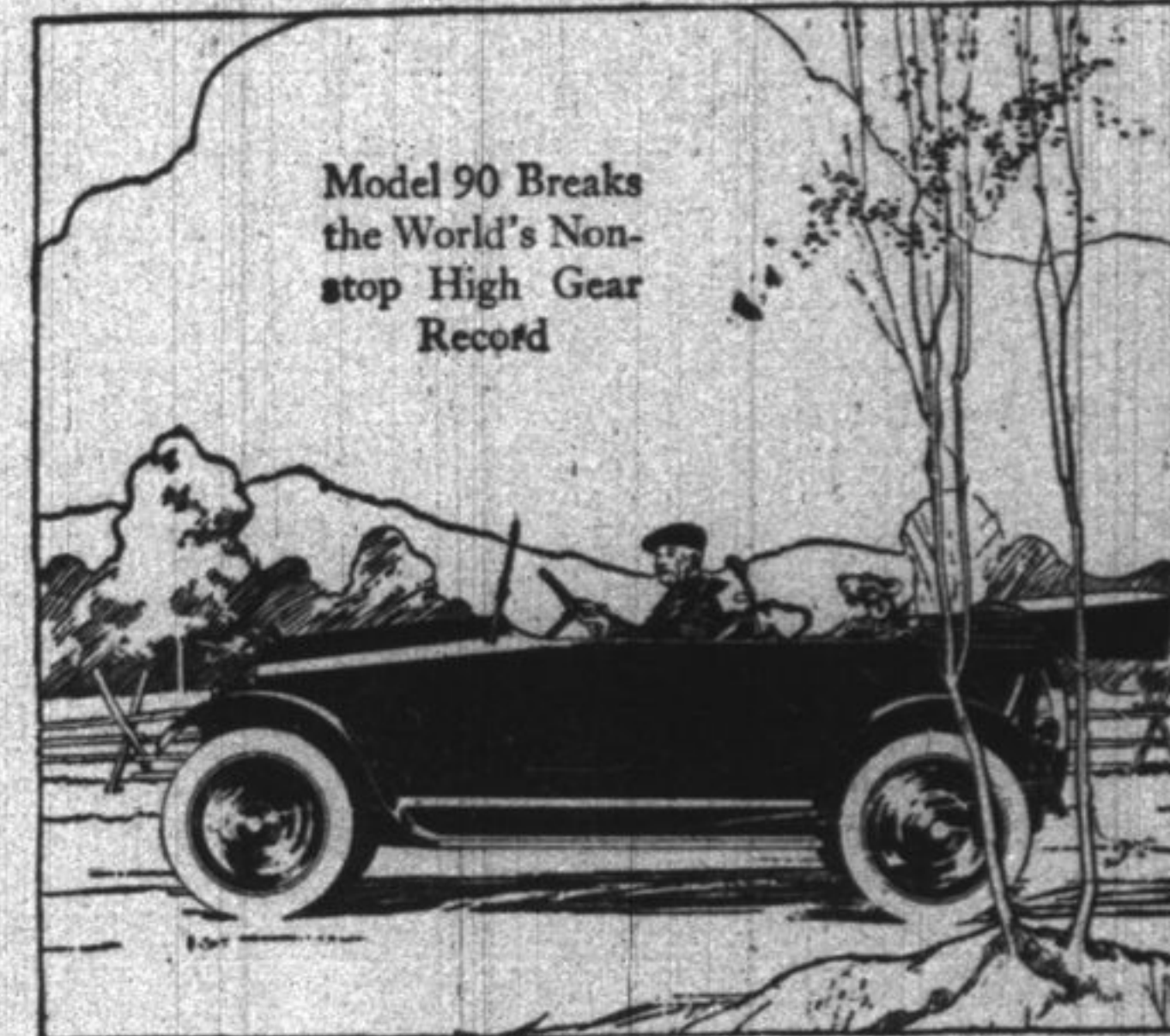
are means of great spiritual helpfulness and are well attended.
