THE CALL OF THE WOODLANDS

Now is the time to see Nature in full bloom, and nowhere in Illinois are there more beautiful lakes, with wooded banks, or beautiful wooded streams than abound in Lake county. It is these that to some extent it is hoped to save for our own free use, and that of future generations, by the proposed Lake County Forest Preserve.

No matter how busy one may be, it is certainly worth one's while to go out and see the beautiful wild flowers, and see and listen to the birds which frequent these spots. Take your lunch along with you, and your car if you have one; if not, there are numerous strips which are close to railroads which can be made afoot.

For instance, one may go to Bangs Lake at Wauconda, or to Lake Zurich, either of these lakes are bordered with woodlands and rolling country, with an abundance of flowers and birds. If you drive, it is only a few miles west from these lakes to the Fox river district southerly through McHenry and Algonquin.

Another trip of interest is to take the Chicago & Milwaukee electric via Lake Bluff to Libertyville, where one may follow the winding Des Plaines River about six miles to Gurnee, which is about five miles west of Waukegan, returning on another branch of the Chicago & Milwaukee electric.

Milwaukee Avenue affords a splendid route toward this Lake region, while, if one lives in Waukegan, the road leading west through Gurnee, if one travels by auto, is paved for a considerable distance with concrete. This leads to numerous lakes in the neighborhood of Lake Villa, while Fox Lake is only a few miles farther.

Those who do not afford a car, and even those who do, would profit greatly by forming little parties or week end-trips, or planning walking parties, thus seeing the beautiful spots in your county, of which you now have no conception. You are sure to return to your work with renewed vigor and interest, well paid for the effort.
