and the poor people get only the simple food.

Industries are Reviving

"In an industrial way, Czechoslovakia is better off than France. In our line the manufacturers are making prompt shipments and are operating to 60 per cent of their normal capacity. Labor shortage caused by war losses and starvation is the greatest handicap to industry in that country.

"In France the porcelain factories are doing only 20 per cent of their normal work, and one of the biggest concerns of France is prepared to furnish only one thirteenth of its pre-war production. Lack of raw material, particularly as applied to coal, still rationed by the government, and the unsettled labor conditions are responsible for the slow revival of industry in France.

"Labor conditions in France are in a bad state. The war seems to have left many of the workers in a state of nervous exhaustion. The high wages paid munitions workers during the war have upset many of the workers who find it difficult to return to pre-war conditions. The French law which enabled workers to refrain workers from paying rents for their homes unless they desired to do so, although requiring the owners to keep the houses in repair and pay the taxes, tended to make the workers extravagant during the high wage period. This labor condition applies to all lines of French industry.

"French manufacturers are receiving many orders, but they cannot get out the goods. The industries of Germany, Austria and Czechoslovakia are much further advanced. The German manufacturers are counting on much business with Russia and the East as soon as conditions become more settled."

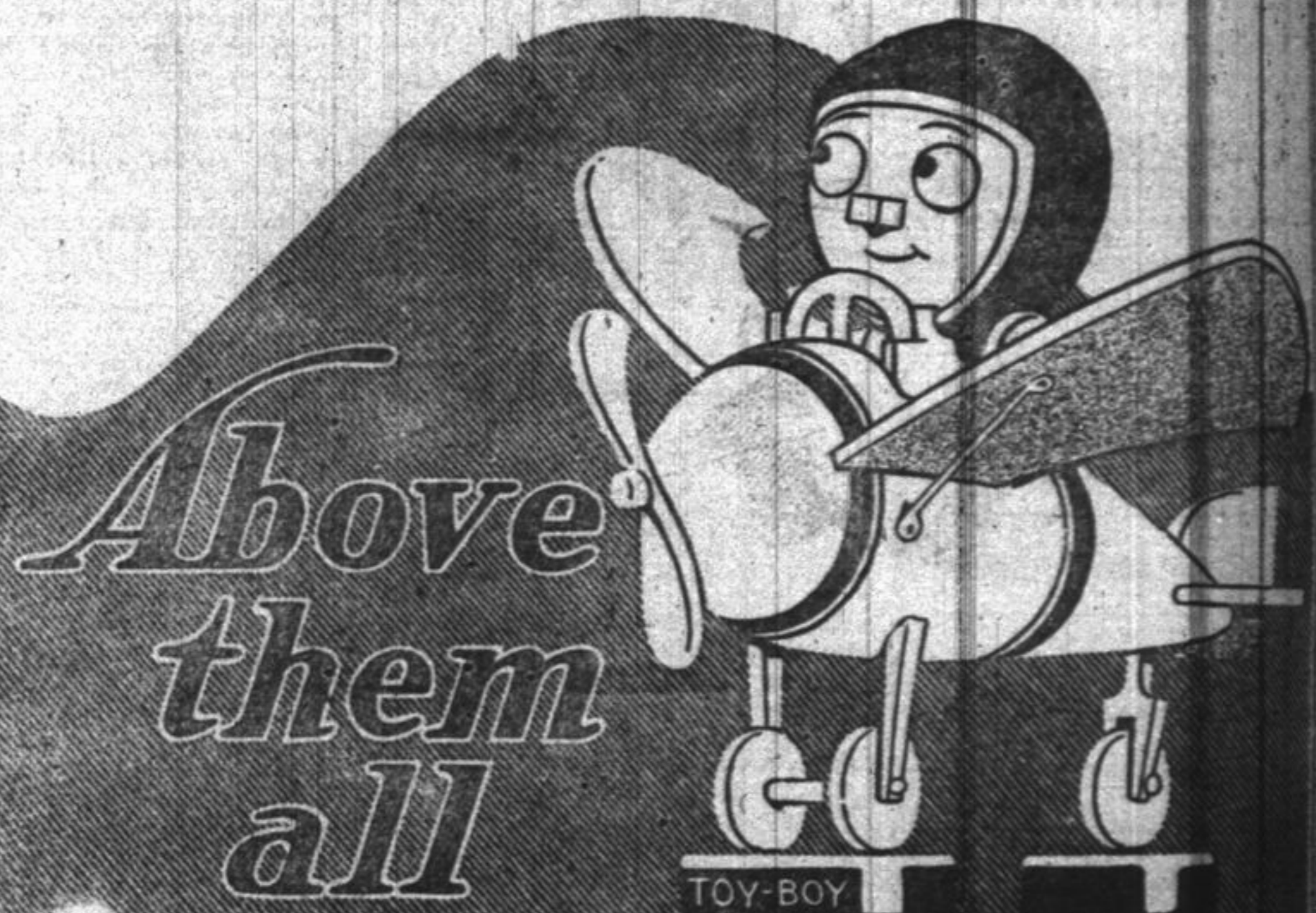
