NEW CONCRETE VIADUCT OVER WAUKEGAN RAVINE

Definite steps toward the construction of a concrete viaduct over the ravine on South Sheridan Road, Waukegan, were taken by the board of local improvements Monday night when a resolution was presented, calling for the construction of such a structure at an estimated cost of \$94,642.63. The resolution was passed and Monday, August 18, was set as the date of the public hearing.

The old iron structure over the ravine on Sheridan road was condemned several years ago and the roadway was shut off shortly after the completion of the Genesee street viaduct in 1913. Of late even the walk for foot traffic has been shut off as the old structure is in such a tottering condition as to be positively a menace to safety.

The specifications show that the proposed new viaduct will be of concrete construction, 120 feet in length and 52 feet in width. Two concrete abutments, each of 30 feet; one at either end of the viaduct will make the structure a total of 180 feet in length. The specifications call for a one arch type.

There is to be a 36 foot roadway with a six foot sidewalk on either side. The railings will be 18 inches wide and these, together with the two six inch curbs, will make up the total width of 52 feet.
