It will also be of interest to know that a new Deaconess home is to be erected just as soon as labor conditions become settled. This home is planned to accommodate sixty-five Deaconesses and nurses connected with the hospital and training school. Its location will be on the N. W. corner of Hudson Ave. and Wisconsin st. The building will be fireproof throughout, and modern in every particular. The price of construction will be upward of \$100,000.

#### PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

The Bible School will meet at nine thirty next Sunday morning.

The morning service will begin at eleven o'clock. The Rev. S. J. Duncan-Clark, formerly pastor of the Christian Church, Toronto, Canada, and on the editorial staff of the "Chicago Evening Post," will speak. August 31 — The Rev. A. A. Pfantstiel, D. D., pastor of the Presbyterian Church from 1896 to 1907. Dr. Pfantstiel needs no introduction to the members of this church. We welcome him to this pulpit on his annual visit to Highland Park.

September 7 — The Rev. Henry Seymour Brown, D. D., Superintendent of the Church Extension work of the Presbytery of Chicago. Mr. Brown was one of our speakers during Holy Week this year and is well known to this membership. He has succeeded Dr. E. P. Hill in the Church Extension work and has carried through a successful year in this department. This church has pledged \$2,500 to the Church Extension work.

September 14 — The Rev. Cleland Boyd McAfee, D. D., Ph. D., pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, Chicago, 1901-04, and of the Lafayette Ave. Presbyterian Church, Brooklyn, 1904-12, and now professor of Systematic Theology, at the McCormick Seminary. This spring Dr. McAfee was one of a small group of ministers sent over to France for special preaching among the American troops. He returned just a few weeks ago and during August is occupying the pulpit of the Central Presbyterian Church, Denver.

#### To Drive Moths From a Piano.

When moths get into a piano the best means of ejecting them is to make up a mixture of turpentine, benzoline and oil of lavender, and squirt this inside the instrument with a scent spray. Use seven parts of benzoline to one of turpentine; add a few drops of lavender to each ounce.
