ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BILL

An Ordinance Making Appropriation for Corporate Purposes for the Fiscal Year from June 1, 1919 to May 31, 1920.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, COUNTY OF LAKE, AND STATE OF ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That the following sums, or so much thereof as may be authorized by law, be and the same are hereby appropriated for corporate purposes for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 1919, and ending May 31, 1920.

Parks, Boulevards, Driveways, and Boating Basins.

For acquiring, laying out, establishing, constructing and maintaining parks, boulevards, drive-ways and boating basins, \$11,770.00.

Salaries of Officers

For salaries of secretary, treasurer, attorney, engineer, clerks, and other employees, including a police force, \$200.00.

Total amount Appropriated

Section 2. All unexpended balances of any item or items of any general appropriations made by this ordinance may be expended in making up any deficiency in any item or items in the same general appropriation and for the same general purpose or in a like appropriation made by this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

When Tobacco Was Taboo.

In 1638 the Massachusetts general court ordered, a writer comments, "that no man shall take any tobacco within 20 poles of any house, or so near as may endanger the same." In 1798 an act was passed forbidding the carrying of fire through the streets except in a covered vessel, smoking, or having in one's possession "any lighted pipe or segar" in the streets or on the wharves. The penalty was \$2. If the offender was in a ropewalk, the penalty was from \$5 to \$100. This prohibition of 1798 was not repealed until 1880.

The very foundation of the Christian Science church was laid in healing works. Before the Christian Science textbook was published, its author and her early students had already demonstrated the propositions afterwards laid down therein. Since then students of that book in all parts of the world have been able to prove the truth of its teachings by removing sickness, poverty, and other ills from their experience according to definite rules of practice.

When Mary Baker Eddy announced that she had discovered the Principle and law of primitive Christian healing, and that because of this discovery it would become universally possible for the sick to be healed by divine power as in the time of Christ Jesus, her announcement met with ridicule and scorn. But Mrs. Eddy had faith in her discovery. Yes, more than faith—she had the absolute conviction and confidence begotten of understanding and demonstration. When the works of Christian Science compelled recognition, effort was made to discredit Mrs. Eddy as its discoverer but this is too signally failed. Today, when there are in different parts of the world more than 1800 Christian Science organizations founded upon the rock of Christ-healing, Mrs. Eddy is justly acknowledged not only as the Discoverer of Christian Science and the revered Leader of the Christian Science movement, but as one of the world's greatest religionists.

One of the evidences of Mrs. Eddy's greatness as a Leader is in her establishment of what is known as The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, of which all of the Christian Science Churches in the world are branches. In founding this church, which embraces all the activities of the Christian Science movement, Mrs. Eddy equipped it with a Manual of By-Laws, which, if followed in letter and in spirit, are adequate to guide the Christian Science movement safely, throughout all time. But Mrs. Eddy could only become a great Leader by first being a good follower, and she said to Christian Scientists, "Follow me only so far as I follow Christ."

Many are now looking forward hopefully and some expectantly to the permanent establishment of "peace on earth and good-will among men." This is surely "a consumma-

tion devoutly to be wished," but it must be admitted that the thoughts of tyranny, injustice, greed, and fear which cause and perpetuate war and strife, are still rampant in all forms of human organization, whether known as governments, churches, commercial associations, labor unions, or families. This is true because these evil mental traits exist to some extent in the consciousness of every human being. Thus it will be seen that the warfare with evil in human consciousness, the mental conflict between right and wrong, must continue until evil-thinking is completely displaced by the Mind of Christ; and then shall the world have peace.

Christian Science is the Science of true living, of real being. Mrs. Eddy, in the Christian Science textbook says (page 128), "The term Science, properly understood, refers only to the laws of God and to his government of the universe, inclusive of man. From this it follows that business men and cultured scholars have found that Christian Science enhances their endurance and mental powers,

enlarges their perception of character, gives them acuteness and comprehensiveness and an ability to exceed their ordinary capacity. A knowledge of the Science of being develops the latent abilities and possibilities of man. It extends the atmosphere of thought, giving mortals access to broader and higher realms. It raises the thinker into his native air of insight and perspicacity.

I should like to leave with you this thought. However baffling your daily problems may seem, however monotonous and distressing the daily routine, however fearful your outlook on tomorrow, you may rest in the assurance that there is a power available to you that is greater than any human power, bigger than any persons, superior to any circumstance or combination of circumstances. That power is the law of Love. It will "turn and overturn," adjust and readjust, until the conscious harmony of your being is established as a present fact. This irresistible law of divine Mind will surely bring forth "thy righteousness as the light and thy judgment as the noonday."
