

**"SEEK YE FIRST THE KINGDOM OF**

TEXT OF S. J. DUNCAN

Well Known Editorial Fills Pulpit at Presbyterian Church Last Sunday Morning

"Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you."—Matthew 6:33

was the text of S. J. Duncan in his remarkable sermon at the Presbyterian church last day morning. In developing theme he points out that the has gone after false god committed itself to the unholy ambitions of materialism, and, ting a premium on material and excitement, has dragged the spiritually minded, against will, into the torrent of this long age. Under such a system struggle for actual existence is the one great end in life, and the end possible.

"The world is sick," said speaker, "thrust a clinical thermometer under its tongue and you find a temperature far above normal. Feel its pulse and you will find a dangerously rapid beat."

It is the aftermath of war, by in the sense that war has stirred and brought to the surface passions for trouble and unrest that developing long before the war.

"War has accelerated evolution," declared the speaker, "and evolution is too much accelerated to be stopped. It is an 'R.'"

"The fact that 'man is a being in a material world brought about a problem. The problem is, 'How can he escape slaving of his spiritual nature by the compelling power of materiality?' Or how can he make material world wholly subservient to the life of the spirit?"

"There have been those who to solve this problem by withdrawing from the world, by living an ascetic life, but this is not the way to be done." "The church," the speaker, "has taken the position of an easy compromise. To the has preached clarity as a grace—to the poor, comfort and charity to cover the sins of a mansion in heaven to comfort for the tenements of poverty."

**Justice Not Charity**

Such a course, he declared, more the program of Jesus of withdrawing from the world to lead an ascetic life. "You very little about charity in the times of Jesus. You will find about justice and love. He scornfully of sins giving—alibi for exploitation in His time. Jesus set the standard human relationship in five words: 'Love thy neighbor as thyself.' Love thy neighbor as thyself, organized on that would not need charity."

"Nor did Jesus preach to the poor. He did not tell who was hungry and ragged homeless to accept these as the dispensation of Providence. He was thus seeking to discipline the hungry that he be fed; he told the poor kingdom belonged to them; the meek that they should inherit the earth. He said, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' He said, 'Come to me, ye that are weary, and I will give you rest.'"
