The girls take the boys out in their chairs, wheeling them to the lake shore and around the Fort. They are then brought to the Y. M. C. A. hut where the girls give a short entertainment consisting of musical selections and readings. The boys are then served with supper at the hut. These affairs are proving to be very popular with the wounded boys.

Rooms for light housekeeping are in great demand. The Y. W. C. A. is unable to fill the many calls which come for one or two rooms with light housekeeping facilities or privileges. We are hoping that more people will feel able to open their homes to the families of the wounded men. It is sometimes impossible to find respectably priced rooms where these people may spend a few days or weeks. It means a great deal to the boys to have their people here, and it is our duty to provide places for them to live.

There is also a great need for small apartments for the families of officers, and single rooms for the reconstruction aides.
