It is illustrated and written in not too technical language, so that one who understands no chemistry at all may read and understand it. It deals less with theory than most chemistries, and deals more with the practical uses of chemicals and chemical experiments in their relations to the business of living.

"Modern Plumbing" is a book on a subject which concerns everyone, but house holders and plumbers most particularly. This is the best work on the subject, illustrated with large and clear diagrams. There is possibly no branch of construction work which has undergone within the same given time such great changes as plumbing construction. These changes which look to the betterment of sanitary conditions, are going on continually. The plumber whose duty it is to execute the work has been most instrumental in bringing about changed conditions. The luxury of modern homes in this country cannot be excelled in any other country, and the latest improvements, some of which are so simple are little understood, and sometimes abused when this abuse often results in costly repair. A book like this will be a real friend in time of need. For those who contemplate building and who want to know more about the best sanitation in plumbing, this book will be indispensable.

"You Never Saw Such a Girl," by Weston who wrote "The Apple Tree Girl," is the merry tale of a country-bred miss who goes to Newport to visit her grandmother whom she had never met and who did not even know of her existence. Imagine her plight when she reached the mansion she sought to find it seemingly deserted. She had no money; the odd motor equipage was gasping for lack of gasoline and it was raining "cats and dogs." So she committed the heinous crime of house-breaking, and from then on events crowded one on another fast and furious. Of course there was a knight-errant-to-be. It is a cheery little romance.

"The Starling," by Juliet Tompkins, is one of the most charming novels she has ever written, although it is quite different from her other stories. The title is taken from Sterne's "I can't get out—I can't get out," said the starling," and the plot concerns a charming little woman and her obtuse husband who built a great hedge about their home and their adorable little daughter. She is the starling. How she got out and how the best of all the worldly world got in, is the plot. To know her father is to know someone very much alive. The personality of him stays with you long after you close the covers of the book. Oh you will be glad that some of the world got in, and yet, you will know too that there was much in the world well shut out!

Here is another "Dere Mable" book and another "Biltmore Oswald" book come to cheer us with their foolishness. "Out O' Luck" finds Biltmore Oswald very much at sea, and "Same Old Bill, Eh, Mable," is the third, best and funniest volume from Bill, written as he gets to Europe and the war ends (just as he expected!).

Kipling's new volume, "The Years Between," Walpole's "Secret City," Vanderlip's "What Happened to Europe," and Wilkinson's "New Voices" are some of the most worthwhile books most in demand. Three of Zane Grey's novels have been added as duplicate copies: "The Last of the Plainsmen," "Wildfire," and "Betty Zane."

Galsworthy's "Five Tales" is a new volume of short stories rivaling in popularity Theodore Dreiser's "Twelve Men."

A gift of six large water-color scenes from famous children's stories has been hung in the children's room. The pictures were used in the July story hours, and were enthusiastically welcomed. Everyone will enjoy them and feel that the public library has one corner especially for children.

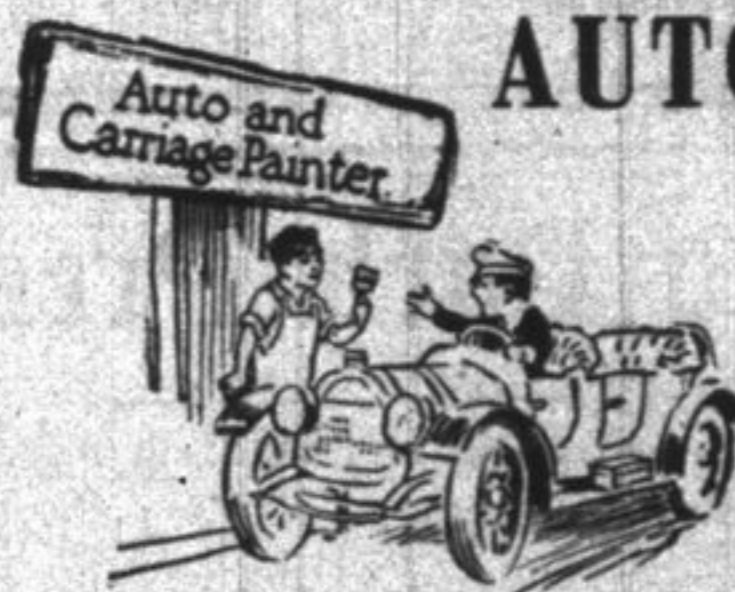
