



The renomination of John Skelton Williams, of Virginia to be Comptroller of the Currency for another five years after a Democratic Senate refused to confirm his nomination at the last session foreshadows a continuance of the fight against Williams' confirmation Representative McFadden, of Pennsylvania, a member of the Banking and Currency Committee, is leading the House opposition to continue ance of the Comptroller's office. He is author of a bill to vest the function of the office in the Federal Reserve Board, asserting that Williams' conduct in office has demonstrated the danger to the country which lies in the abuse of large powers granted to individual Federal officers when those officers are inclined to be autocratic. Indications are the Senate will again refuse to confirm Williams.
