Employment Work

There has been some misunderstanding in regard to the employment work carried on by the Association. We are glad to act as an employment agency to some extent, but our efforts cannot be designated as a regular employment agency. Girls and women often come to the room looking for positions, and we are able—with very few exceptions—to find positions for them. It is not always possible for us, however, to fill calls for girls and women, which come to us.

We are very glad to help employers and girls seeking positions whenever it is possible for us to do so.

Girl Reserves

All girls between the ages of 8 and 18 years are invited to become members of one of the five corps of Girl Reserves which are now holding their regular meetings at the Y. W. C. A. The clubs were very popular among the girls last year, and the total membership was 75 girls. Indications are that the membership will be increased this year, and that the girls will be more enthusiastic than ever.

Hikes and parties will give variety to the club meetings; but the aim of the organization is to teach girls to be more healthy and helpful in their homes and in the community, and more eager for knowledge.

Bluebird Girls

The Bluebird Corps of Girl Reserves, composed of high school girls, will have its first fall meeting on Friday afternoon, at the Association rooms. Every member should plan to be present, and all new girls will be welcome. The plans for the fall will be discussed.

Friendship Club

The Friendship Club will meet on Thursday evening, at 8. This will be an important meeting, which no member can afford to miss.
