**NATURALIZING BULBS**  
There is nothing more fascinating than the naturalization of hardy bulbs and ferns, except it be that of songbirds.  
These may be planted either in the woods, amongst the shrubs, or in front of the perennial border. For early bloom some of them beat the bluebirds in earliness, and they give an abundance of flowers from early March until June, at a really very small cost, since they are permanent.
