COUNTY BOARD BUYS A DETENTION HOME

The Detention home committee held a meeting Saturday following authorization from the board of supervisors, and purchased for the county the large residence on North Jackson street, Waukegan, formerly occupied by Capt. Cook, which is now being used as a home for dependent children under the supervision of the juvenile court.

The purchase price was \$7,500. The committee has also been authorized to make needed improvements to increase the capacity of the home to shelter 16 more children. The property was owned by E. G. Moniger of Chicago. Miss Carrie Smith is superintendent of the home and the surroundings for juvenile work there have been so satisfactory, the board decided to purchase the property after having rented it for about a year.
