FINAL APPEAL BY THE AMERICAN RED CROSS

FRANK CHENEY CHAIRMAN

Girl Scouts and Girl Reserves Making House-to-House Canvass for Renewed Memberships

The Red Cross is conducting this week a nation-wide drive for funds to carry on its present reconstruction plans. In Highland Park this drive is under the management of Frank L. Cheney, assisted by the Girl Scouts organization and the Girl Reserves. Mr. Cheney will send the official appeal for funds by mail while the Girl Scouts and the Girl Reserves will make a house-to-house canvass for renewed memberships the Red Cross.

The war is over, but there is work to be done. There are thousands of men still in hospitals, reconstruction camps who need to be cared for some time to come. It is not possible to finish before the last disabled soldier is properly trained and fitted for usefulness in the struggle for existence. There are little things too whose welfare must be looked after until such time as the husband and father is once more equipped for the economic struggle.

It is their intention to raise ten per cent of the amount subscribed last year, believing that this sum will care of all the cases which are being turned over to various departments of war work have been turned over to the Red Cross, and it has become a thing house for all claims. It has been fore devolved upon the Red Cross to carry on a certain amount of work such as was done by the City of Columbus, Jewish Welfare Y. M. C. A.

Relief Work to be Completed
The end of the duties of the American Red Cross abroad is in sight. The main objective of the organization now is to conclude their work in an orderly and businesslike manner. The United States Government has placed in the hands of the Red Cross to be used in need work in Europe, \$35,000,000 medical and food supplies. No other organization which has been entrusted by the government with a responsibility of this magnitude.

In the United States
While the overseas work is rapidly toward completion, much of war has brought to the American Red Cross new and domestic responsibilities.

Final Appeal
This is the last appeal necessary for the need from the Great War, but entrusted to the Red Cross finished with the economy which has characterized operation throughout the war.

Disaster Relief
The American Red Cross national clearing house for relief, and is constantly rushing supplies and nurses to the front. The destruction wrought by the Red Cross within a few hours of supplies, nurses and experienced in such situations.
