\$5,000 APPROPRIATED TO RESURFACE ROAD

Representative Chindblom Responsible for the Improvement of Sheridan Road

Through the efforts of our representative, Mr. Carl R. Chindblom, an appropriation of \$5,000 has been secured from the Navy department to assist in resurfacing the Sheridan road between Lake Bluff and North Chicago.

During the recent activities of the Great Lakes Training Station, they have used this highway practically as a freight yard, and have torn it up time and time again in installing utilities for the Station, which, together with the immense traffic, which they have caused on this road, has made it practically impossible to maintain in good condition for any length of time, and the maintenance, such as it has been, has devolved upon the Town of Shields for a station which is of national scope and benefit.

Mr. Charles E. Russell, Lake County Superintendent of Highways, has taken this matter up with the Navy department and through the efforts of Mr. Chindblom, expressed in conferences with Secretary Daniels and others of the Department of the Navy and the Bureau of Yards and Docks, has been able to secure the appropriation to assist in resurfacing the road, so that it may be in better condition for traffic next season. Next year the Green Bay road will be shut off for a considerable portion of the season, on account of the construction of Federal Aid road, which will leave the Sheridan road the only road for traffic between Chicago and Milwaukee.
