

The commission earnestly urges upon the public the necessity of cooper-40 ation in every way possible to make this order effective, and expressly urges upon the domestic consumers of gas and electricity the importance of reducing their consumption of the same to the very lowest point possible, lest there be none for their necessities within a very short time.
