AGED HIGHWOOD RESIDENT FOUND DEAD TUESDAY

Patrick Hickey Succumbs to Organic Heart Disease. Funeral Services Tomorrow at St. James'

Mr. Patrick D. Hickey, a resident of Highwood for the past 40 years, died suddenly Monday night or Tuesday morning at the home of his son as the result of organic heart disease from which he has suffered for a number of years.

Mr. Hickey had retired at nine p. m. on Monday, feeling in the best of health. In the morning his daughter-in-law went to awaken him and found him dead.

He was sixty-seven years of age and had been in civil service in the capacity of blacksmith at Fort Sheridan for the past 40 years.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow morning in St. James Church, in Highwood. Interment will be made in Lake Forest cemetery.

Mr. Hickey leaves two sons, James, of Highwood, and Patrick, of Minneapolis, to survive him.

 houses, and motion picture houses outside of hours of operation shall be only sufficient to safeguard against freezing.

Must Economize
 Drug stores, meat markets, and grocers, bread makers, hotels and restaurants are not restricted as to hours of operation but are required to exercise all possible economy in heat, light and power.

It is further ordered that each of said utilities shall make publication of this order, or the substance thereof, in at least three papers published in the county in which said utility has its main office or place of business, and each utility is hereby authorized to cut off and discontinue its service to any consumer, who, after such publication, and while this order is in force, shall fail to observe any of the above rules and regulations.

The commission earnestly urges upon the public the necessity of cooperation in every way possible to make this order effective, and expressly urges upon the domestic consumers of gas and electricity the importance of reducing their consumption of the same to the very lowest point possible, lest there be none for their necessities within a very short time.
