ing, and a shore drive at the foot of the bluffs east of Sheridan road. The second group is west toward the Skokie. Already there is Skokie park of forty acres, Boal park, also of forty acres, and "Wooded Island," of twenty acres. Connecting boulevards are planned.

Although the forest preserve district has not made a definite statement regarding acquisition of Skokie property, the Winnetka plan shows a "proposed forest preserve" running from the south to the north village limits and extending from the Northwestern cutoff east and connecting with the present parks.
Winnetka now has about ninety-five acres devoted to parks. With the additions planned the total would be 120 or an acre for each 100 residents, based on a population of 13,000. This proportion is considered satisfactory in view of the proposed Skokie preserve and eventual lake shore improvements.

The town's community center will be west of the tracks, but it will not be confined to that section. Linden street, between Elm and Oak streets, will be widened and the village hall built in the center of the block, facing the station. In the triangular park between the station and hall a fountain or statue is planned.

The buildings on each side of the hall will be made to conform architecturally with the municipal structure. In the block west of the hall the present Horace Mann school eventually will be done away with and a community theatre and center built. Connecting the village hall and the community auditorium will be a stretch of lawn. Surrounding the auditorium will be an open space for recreation and athletics.

Directly east of the union station the business block will be rebuilt to harmonize with the village plan and in the center of the block will be the postoffice. The present buildings are to be sent back fifty-five feet. Back of them will be a space for garages. An attempt will be made to have practically all village stores rebuilt so as to make the entire business district harmonious.

Effective Zoning
And of course Winnetka is thoroughly alive to the desirability of zoning itself properly and promptly. A zoning commission, of which E. A. Rummier is chairman, has been named to draw up a zoning ordinance. Mr. Bennett, however, has gone ahead and planned for a careful zoning of Winnetka. Special areas adjacent to the railroads are to be devoted to the storage of coal, food supplies and building materials. Garages, laundries and greenhouses will be provided for in special districts. Residential areas will be divided into several classes, one for group houses and one for single family residences, the latter including large areas at considerable distance from the railroad stations where subdivision into small lots would be discouraged and, if possible, prevented. A minimum width of 50 feet for each lot is proposed.
So, you see, here's another north shore town lining up with Glencoe as a doer, not merely a talker—of zoning—a subject which Highland Park would do well to consider.
