### INTERESTING PROGRAM AT D.-S. HIGH SCHOOL

To Discuss the Movement to Reconstruct High School Education

On Thursday evening, Jan. 8, the Parent-Teacher association of the high school are inviting all the parents of the district whether they have children of high school age or not, to attend a meeting in the girls' gymnasium. Invitations have gone out to secretaries of Parent-Teacher associations at the Elm Place, Lincoln Ravinia, Lake Forest and Deerfield schools to attend this joint meeting in a body.

It is expected that the gym will be filled to overflowing for there will be an unusually interesting program. There will be music by the school musical organization. There will also be folk dancing and a one act play by students of the high school, also an exhibition of manual training work.

All this will be preliminary to the main purpose of the meeting which is to learn about the movement to reconstruct the high school education in the state of Illinois, to make it observe more fully the new needs of these new times.

### COURT LECTURE ROOM A NOTABLE VENTURE

A notable artistic venture in Chicago, and one worthy of mention to fiction readers of Highland Park, is that of the Court Lecture Room series of lectures by poets, authors, and playwrights.

The Court Lecture Room, so called because it opens on the Venetian court of the Fine Arts building, was formerly the Little Theatre, and the Pond Lyceum Bureau is trying to compensate devotees of that artistic center, for its loss.

At these gatherings one sees Chicago's literati, both real and social, its critics, professors, and others interested in "books and things." These four o'clock gatherings on Sunday afternoons are marked by a delightful spirit of informality. A homelike atmosphere pervades the little group of a hundred souls while the notable speaks, after which the curtains are drawn back, revealing the cosy tea room with its tiny white tables and steaming samovar. Tea is served by the management as part of the program, and every one carries for this important feature. At this auspicious moment the great one comes down to the tea-drinking level of ordinary mortals, and everybody talks to everybody else. Meanwhile the speaker addresses his words of wisdom to any one who happens to be close at hand, and permits those who are reckless with their illusions, to talk his halo quite away.
