It was highly desirable to remain as tenants. This conclusion was strengthened by the fact that the present quarters have been improved with special features in the way of construction, furniture built in, partitions and a large fire place, and many other features that the community will get the benefit of by retaining the premises.

Accordingly, it was unanimously voted to decline the generous offer of the Highland Park Woman's Club with regret and with thanks, appreciating fully the fine spirit that caused the ladies to make the offer, and to request the Community Service of Highland Park to enter into the lease for two years, with an option of an additional year, proposed by Mr. Fletcher.

It is the earnest hope of all who have the best interests of the community at heart that by the time this lease expires, Highland Park will have built its own community house, equipped to meet the wants and needs of everybody, and it is confidently believed that the inauguration of real community work in a modest community center will foster and further develop the splendid community spirit that now exists.

For the purpose of bringing the facts of the situation properly before the community, a Publicity Committee has been appointed, with R. C. Jacobsen as Chairman, and to plan and carry out the campaign for raising the necessary funds, a Finance Committee has been appointed, with Frank L. Cheney as Chairman.

The Community Service of Highland Park is to be organized as an Illinois corporation not for profit and every person in the community, upon payment of a membership fee of One Dollar per year, becomes a member and entitled to all of the privileges of the community center. Of course, it is self-evident that a sufficient fund to operate the community center could not be raised from such memberships and it is planned that each member of the community shall contribute according to his or her means and willingness toward the fund for the annual maintenance of community work. Highland Park has always done its part in every movement for community betterment and it will not fail this time to "go over the top."
