SHORT COURSE BEING GIVEN

Farmers and young men who are interested in agriculture will soon be arriving at the University from all parts of the state to attend the two weeks' course in agriculture being held from January 19 to 30, 1920. As the work offered consists of lectures and laboratory exercises arranged to meet the needs of young men and farmers throughout the state, the course is called the Corn Growers' and Stockmen's Convention, and is the nineteenth annual meeting of the kind. Systematic instruction will be given in stock judging, study of soils, farm crops, dairying, and farm mechanics.

A number of lectures of prominence will be present, among whom will be Honorable Charles H. Brough, governor of the state of Arkansas; David Kinley, acting president, University of Illinois; Honorable Henry M. Dunlap, Savoy, Ill.; Honorable H. T. Green, Urbana; Harvey J. Sconce, president Illinois Agricultural Association, Sidel; Hon. Francis G. Blair, state superintendent of public instruction, and others.

Memorial exercises for Dr. C. G. Hopkins will be held Thursday afternoon and evening, January 22. Dr. Hopkins, the greatest soil expert of the age, died at Gibraltar last October while on his way home from Greece where he had been helping the Greeks reclaim their worn-out soil. As he was known by all farmers and others interested in agriculture this will be a most fitting time for the memorial service.

The only expense of this course will be that of travel and living expenses while here, as no fees of examinations are required.
