

A RARE BIRD VISITS THIS PART OF COUNTRY

Bohemian Waxwings from the Far North Visits this County About Every Ten Years

A rare bird from the far north which visits this county about every ten years in winter, is with us again. A letter from Nathan Leopold, Jr., a former Highland Park boy, to Mr. Coale, told of its first arrival:

"My Dear Mr. Coale: Just thought that I would drop you a line to let you know of a very interesting experience which I had today.

I was out with a friend endeavoring to make a Thanksgiving bird list in Jackson Park this morning when I stumbled on a flock of about 300 Bohemian Waxwings (*Bombycilla garrula*) calmly enjoying their Thanksgiving repast, which consisted of some small red berries.

I looked up this rather rare bird in Woodruff's "Birds of the Chicago Area" and found that you had made a record of it in 1880. This seems rather like ancient history to me, since I cannot imagine so many years ago. They were all in excellent plumage, and very tame."

The following Sunday Colin Sanborn and H. L. Stoddard of the Field Museum, went up to Beach, a desert tract along the lake, north of Waukegan, and searched the groves

of pine trees and junipers for Waxwings. It was very cold and a high wind blowing, and although they saw many flocks flying south, very few came within range, and were very wild. A number of specimens were taken, and a pair of Red Crossbills, which were the only ones seen.

A week later "Buddie" Reesman saw a flock of twenty waxwings in a mountain ash in his yard. They were eating the berries, and remained several days until every berry was eaten. A flock was also seen by Mr. E. S. Churchill on Green Bay road. There were between 40 and 50 of the birds feeding on the highbush cranberries, and showed no fear of his passing near them. Mrs. Carleton Moseley reports having a flock of over a hundred cedar waxwings about her grounds December 7 to 15. This is the smaller variety (*Bombycilla cedrorum*) which nests here and remains often late in the season. Both species have crests and wax like tips on the wings.

MEXICAN EMBASSY DENIES OIL SHORTAGE

Says Mexican Government is not Preventing Production or Exportation of Oil

The Mexican Embassy has received the following official report from the Department of Industry, Commerce and Labor:

"The production of Mexican petroleum, far from having decreased, is progressively increasing. At the beginning of the present year the potential daily capacity of all wells was 1,400,000 barrels. In the middle part of said year it was 1,800,000 and today it is over 2,000,000. Notwithstanding the fact that four petroleum wells have gone dry, the owners are only using 12 per cent of the potential capacity due to the lack of vessels for transportation, a cause entirely apart from the Mexican petroleum policy, and the regulations of the Government, which only seeks the compliance of its laws. The petroleum supply could be increased eight times if there were vessels, even without drilling new wells. The production of petroleum during the last year was 64,000,000 barrels, and in the present year it will be over 80,000,000 barrels."

In view of the foregoing information the Mexican Embassy is in a position to deny emphatically the rumors which are being spread with the idea of making the American people

believe that the Mexican petroleum industry is decreasing, whereas statistics prove the contrary.

The Mexican Government is not preventing the production or the exportation of oil by any owners thereof, and while on four or six cases it has been deemed expedient to exact compliance from those who have disregarded the laws and regulations regarding the boring of new wells, there is cause to fear a shortage of Mexican oil supply attributable to any action of the Mexican Government. The shortage may be caused by oil producers or by transportation companies who cannot or do not wish to ship this article out of Mexico.
