### WHAT'S A BUDGETTEER?

An interesting feature of the campaign being launched by the Woman's Department of the Fair Price Commission of Illinois—created by the U. S. Government to aid in the weeding out of profiteering and the establishing of fair prices for necessities—is the advent of The Budgetteers.

What's a Budgetteer? Listen to Mrs. Joseph T. Bowen, state chairman of the Woman's Department.

"All a woman has to do to become a Budgetteer," says Mrs. Bowen, "is to agree to adopt a budget system for her family expenses—that is, to settle on what proportion of it shall be paid for food, what clothing, what rent, etc., and to live within those sums. If the budget system could be established in every family in Illinois, the problem of extravagant buying, which goes hand in hand with the other causes of present soaring prices, would be solved forever. Most of what we call extravagance is called by disproportionate buying—that is, spending the money in hand for the need or desire of the moment without considering or knowing the other items of family expenditure which remain to be taken care of."

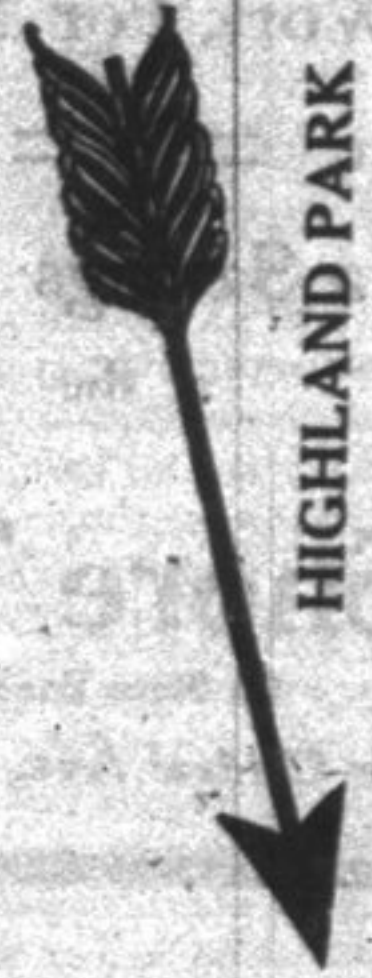
