**A TRIBUTE**

When I read in the last issue of The Press that Mrs. Palmer A. Montgomery had passed away, I recalled to mind a beautiful work of philanthropy not included in the printed list of her activities. In the early days of Highland Park a family lived here who entertained royally. Money came easily to them and was spent just as easily. After some years reverses came, and, broken in health and spirit, the family were in real need. Then Mrs. Montgomery, who had not shared in the family's prosperity as long as some of us, took upon herself the task of seeing them supplied with the necessities of life. She arranged with a vocational association in Chicago to take each month's bills to them for which they gave her a check then she paid the bills and sent them, receipted, to the association. The men who held mortgages on the home were patient and the local tradesmen, all of whom had unpaid accounts on their books against this family, simply pocketed their losses. I personally know that one man lost \$1000.00 in this case. Thus, thru Mrs. Montgomery's work and influence, this elderly man and woman were allowed to spend their last days in comfort, and amid pleasant surroundings.
